God. Therefore willing to mend the mortality of the body
that it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make
I declare this my last will & testament. That is to say
Principally & first of all I give & bequeath my soul to
Almighty God who gave it. Nothing doubting but
I shall receive the same again resuscitated today or by
at the General resurrection by the Mighty power of
God. & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion
of my executors. And as Touching such worldly goods
& estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in
this life I give, Devise, Bequeath & dispose of the same
in the following manner & form. Item 1 I leave
all my lawful debts. If several charges to be honestly
paid out of the whole of my estate. Item 2d I give & bequeath
unto Sarah my dearly beloved wife. a Young son
Mary, her saddle horse & furniture together with
one third part of the plantation whereon I now
dwelt during her natural life. Item 2d I give to
Sarah & unto my beloved daughter Sarah Scott
& to my well beloved daughter Mary Scott 1.
each of them one horse & saddle & a bed &
bed clothes & bedding & a suit of clothes
Dresser & chair & a few other articles of estate
and especially interest for her until her
marriage.

at eighteen years of age & to have the copse of her
laboring paid out of the value of my moveable estate.

Item 3^d I give & bequeath unto my wife inward
son David Sloan a certain tract of land containing
three hundred acres or there abouts which I bought from
W. Parker Item 4^e I give, do bequeath unto
my well beloved son John Sloan Robert Sloan all the
rest of my descented land which I allow to be equally
divided between them & Robert Sloan shall part
whereon may desirring him soe to do to all
into his proprieetie thereof uppon his attins at the age of
Twenty one years. Allowing reasonable paym't to my said son
Robert to give his mother one convenient room in
said dwelling house to give her a comfortable
habitation & to keep & maintain one man for his said
mother during her bedidd hood. Item 5^f I give and
bequeath unto my well beloved son James Sloan
Twenty pounds to be paid out of my moveable estate
& it is my will that my said son James be bound
out by my Executors to learn the blacksmith trade
or any other creditable trade which he may choose
and lastly it is my will that all the rest, Remainder &
Residue of my goods, chattels & moveable estate be sold
at publick Vender & the money thereon arising / after
deducting what is mentioned above / to be equally
divided between me & my dearey beloved wife & my
seven children — and I do hereby nominate constiute
& appoint my dearey beloved wife Sarah Sloan, my
beloved son David Sloan together with my dearey &
beloved Brother John Sloan to be Executors of this
my last will & Testament, & I do hereby utterly renne
& disallow all former wills Testaments or Executors
by me in any wise made nominate or appointed
Partifying & confirming this & nothing to be my last will
& Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this Twenty fourth day
of March in the year of our Lord Christ 1772

 as it hath pleased God to bless me with a numerous fa-
 mily & a little of this world's goods I do now to dispose of
 what of the world's goods I am possessed of leaving my wife &
 family in the following manner ~~then~~ I begin with to my
 well beloved wife ~~but~~ my dearest friend a young boy now
 called with other children the back & bedding of old clothes with
 his spinning wheel & the bedstead of the same & clothes
 effects of good & better, Together with his living on the
 place I now suppose during his sickness & a coat I bought
 from brother Lawrence Easton son of Ebenezer and then
 with his wearing apparel ~~then~~ I begin with to my well
 beloved son William to whom of the above I do
 now leave one of slate here described & beginning
 at the top corner of that field between the old school
 house from thence to a white oak standing in the field right
 over the garden from thence a straight line as far as to
 my son's line or claim goes all on the south & east side
 of the above described line I begin with unto my son
 William together with my blue suit of clothes his horse
 & saddle it is to be observed that the line from said field
 goes to last as far as my claim ~~then~~ I begin the

line to last from Thomas Stewart his house
