In the name of God Amen. The 18th day of April 1788
I James Walker of the County of Rockingham State of North
~~Carolina~~ being in perfect health of body & of perfect
mind & memory thanks be to God, therefore calling to
mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die, do make & Ordain
this my last Will & Testament, that is to say principally
- First of all, I give & recommend myself into the hands
of God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the dis-
cretion of my executors. Nothing obstructing but at
the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God. As touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give Dennis & Elizur of the same in the following
manner & form - ~~in premises~~ I give & bequeath to
my dearly beloved wife the one third of all house pro-
perty, her bed & furniture belonging to it, with all
her bodily cloathing, one bay horse mare & saddle
one cow & yearling calf - ~~then~~ I give & bequeath to
my well beloved son Robert Walker one hundred
fifty acres of the upper end of my tract of Land
beginning George Allen's line running to the estate -
thirty pounds good & lawful money with two
year old yearling colt his ~~name~~ I give & bequeath
to my wife before named straight & right one pound more
& saddle & bridle her bed & furniture with all her
other Cloathing from year old colt - ~~then~~ I give
to my well beloved son William Walker one hundred

and last formerly called his Saddle & bridle - Item I make & desire my well beloved wife to have her living on the land with the provisidege of the dwelling whilast a widow - all my just debts to be paid of the Estate & the remainder of all the land excepted to be divided equally in six parts amongst the rest of the children that is to say John & JAMES & HENRY and MARY & ANN & BONNIE to have two parts out of the six the said to remain for maintenance of the family Robert to have part excepted until Henry is of age yet then John to have one hundred & fifty acres of the Land next the Creek including the field next the Scaff & him to pay to his sister Ann Twenty pound when the land is divided, and James to have the land with the rest of the improvements paying thereof Forty pounds - Item I leave to William my Coalclotie and to John my son Half Item I do make, constitute & relate my dearly beloved wife MARY Walker and Robert Graham my sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament, all thing under my hands Mysigns & Seals partly by them to be sealed & Testified, how I do here by letterly declaration make & disannul all & every other former Will & Testament Wills & Bequests, & Dispositions & confirming them or other Executors by me in any wise before named Will & Testament made - Ratifying & confirming this no other to be my last Will & Testament In witness whereof there hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said James Walker as his last Will & Testament in the presence of
