In the name of God Lamen, James Walker of the County of
Mecklenburg & State of N. Carolina, hereto being very sickly
& weak in perfect health of body but not of perfect
mind & memory thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind
the mortatility of my body & knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last
will & testament, that is to say principally & first of all
I give & recommend my soul to the hand of Almighty God
that gives it, and my body I recommend to the Earth
to be buried in decent Christian burial at the dis-
cretion of my Executor, nothing danting but at
the general resurrection I shall receive the same again
by the mighty power of God; and as touching such world
as by estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this
life I give & devise & dispose of the same in the fol-
lowing manner & form — First I give & bequeath to
Margaret my deare & well beloved wife to
off the said plantation where she now lives
her lifetime & the thirds of the same at my death
Four white mare & three Cows & the said horse that she
now lives in — Also I give to my wife before & for
Matherne the sum of thirty pounds in money, & then
I give & bequeath to my sons, James & Robert this

In the plantation where I now live at my desire
 I give & bequeath to daughter Elizabeth the sum of
 Twenty pounds & her having off the plantation while
 she lives safely & to my daughter & brother the sum of
 five shillings Sterling, my executor is Robert Walker, and I do hereby
 William Hobl & Margaret Walker, and I do hereby
 utterly disown, Revoke & disannul all & every
 other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests &
 executors by me in any wise before named written
 & by me attested, Ratifying & confirming this one other
 to be my last will & Testament, in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 26 day of
 July 1735 - signed, sealed, published
 pronounced & declared by the said James Walker
 to be his last will & Testament in the presence
 of us who in the presence of each other
 have hereunto subscribed our names -

In the name of God Amen, I William Mylin being weak
 in body but of sound mind & memory thank be to God,
 therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and
 that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make
 & bid in this my last will & Testament Viz Principles
 first of all I give my soul unto the hands of Almighty
 God that gave it, and my body I commend
 to the dust to be buried in a decent manner at the
 discretion of my Executors; but as touching such time
 state wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in
 this life, I give & dispose of the same in the following
 manner & from Viz. I give & bequeath unto Robert
 Mylin my beloved son all that piece of land or part of land
 laid off by Daniel Hobl bearing the dividing
