Being in a low state of health & willing to mind
all mortals are born to die, I resign my soul to
God who gave it, and also hereby constitute this
my last will & Testament, disposing of my personal
real Estate as follows viz -

Item I bequeath to my son John H. Miller my negro man
named Abe which he has now in possession -

Item I bequeath to my son William H. Miller fifteen hundred
dollars in money to be paid in three different pay
ments in every three years & that in addition
to of fifteen hundred which I have advanced to
him while at Colledge also I include in this
fifteen hundred dollars five hundred a legacy
left him in my hands by his grand father John
H. Knill Alexander -

Item I bequeath to my son James Miller a negro fellow
named Harry & his wife firmly also does a young est
child yet the child to remain on the farm or with
its mother for two years, also I bequeath to him
one warrant obtained at Hentzville for quarter

Section of Land now in my possession also five
hundred Dollars in Money to be paid me a year
after my decease, also a waggon & gear three horse
creatures a gray horse & two black ones, two kids
& furniture & no special share of the rest of my house
hold property at the disposition of my Executors

Item I bequeath to my sons Joseph & Edmund the plan-
station where I now live Jointly to them Equally
to be divided between Edmund & James of age it being
in quantity 210 acres also to my son Joseph
bequeath my negro fellow step son & my negro
Wench Dreda & her child Siddy

Item I bequeath to my son Elizabeth a tract of land I have
named of John Sharpe at two different times of about
one hundred & thirty acres, also I bequeath to him
a negro boy, also a negro girl by name of Venus

Item I bequeath to my son Edmund a negro boy
Named Joe & Margaret their youngest child

Item It is my wife's desire that my sons Joseph and
Edmund remain on the farm with Sarah their W:
other necessary utensils as shall appear necessary
say for carrying on the farm at the discretion of
good sense of my Executors. I also do appoint
Kimpson my son William to settle my debts
money to cost & settle the Estate. My interest of my
wife's Estate, has lately deceased in South Carolina
York district with all the power & authority that
I might or could have been having. & to draw
& collect all my interest claim that I have to
said Estate & he to return it to my Executors
as soon as settled. Also I wish all my debts
to be collected & all properties not bequeathed
that not be thought fit by my Executors for the

Subject of the same to be apportioned to public sale
 the person or persons left in my estate be
 made & with any remaining funds to be equally
 divided amongst my six sons to them & their children
 I do hereby constitute & appoint my respectable
 friends Isaac Alexander & John H. H. my executors
 to execute this my last will & Testament also I
 appoint my son Joseph as soon as he becomes
 capable to join in with the above named Executrix
 in Pittsboro whereof I have set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 8th December 1814.
