Then I give & bequeath to my daughter Jennet the sum of Ten dollars.

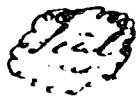
Then I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary the sum of Ten dollars and a Cow and Calf—

And lastly I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my Trusty & well beloved friends, John Beatty & James Taggart to be my whole & sole Executors of this my last will & Testament, & they do solemnly disavowing & disannulling all other wills Legacies & bequests by me heretofore made, Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament; In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 26th Day of September—
