once to die, Do make thus & Ordain this my last Will & Testa-
ment it is to say principally & first of all I give & recommend my
Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it & my body
I recommend to the earth to be buried at the discretion of my exec-
utors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the hand of God, As touching my
worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
with in this life I give & divide & dispose of the same in
the following manner & form Expresses I give & bequeath
to my first youngest child Joseph Thompson, Benjamin
Thompson, Maria Thompson & E. Thompson & Maria
Thompson all my Estate at their Mothers decease & the
decease of my wife to be equally divided amongst them & the
rest of my children the sum of one Shilling Sterling apiece
for they have had their share before. I bequeath & constitute this
my last Will & Testament all & singular parts to be kept
& enjoyed, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & annul
all & every other, former Testaments Wills Legacies & bequests
Exchanges by me in anywise before written Wills & Legacies

Relapsing & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament

day & year first written, signed sealed published pronounced declared
by the said Jennings Thompson as his last will & testament in the

County & State of N^o Carolina. Being weak in body of a sound
& perfect mind & memory. Do make & declare this to be my last will
& testament; First. I Bequeath my soul to Almighty God who gave it
me & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the
discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, And first I Give & Bequeath
all the Land & Plantation I now live on to John O'Brien him, paying unto
Matthew O'Brien his brother the one half Value of the first tract that was
purchased which was one hundred & twenty acres provided the said John
O'Brien gives up to the Estate the money he lent uncle Benjamin Thomas
now deceased to purchase the last forty acres that is added unto first
tract, Likewise it is my will & desire that all the remainder of my Estate
both real & personal be equally divided between John O'Brien and
Matthew O'Brien together with seven Negroes namely, Annasville
Judy, Cambridge, Milly, London, Daniel & James with all my Stock
of horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep & all my household furniture & crops, Likewise
it is my will & desire that there should not be any one of the Negroes sold
but that the said O'Brien named John O'Brien & Matthew O'Brien
divide them agreeable to the price value of them to them & their
Heirs forever. And lastly I appoint John O'Brien & Matthew
my Executors as witnesses I have hereunto set my hand and
this 26th day of October 1793
