In the name of God amen I John Barnell of Mecklenburg
County & State of N. Carolina, being weak of body but sound of
mind & memory Blessed be God, Do this 27th day of July in the
year of our Lord 1804 and of the 27th of the American Ind. Freedom
make & ordain this my last will & testament, desiring & intending
that all other wills or Wills by me heretofore made in
any wise & whatever, and do now dispose of my property in
the following manner that is to say

Item 1st It is my will & desire & I do hereby leave my negro woman
Mary to be sold to the highest bidder and one hundred Dollars of
the price to be equally divided between Samuel Elliotts children
that he now has by his wife Anna to wit Thomas Elliott, John Elli-
ot Martha Elliott, Elvise Elliott, Robert Elliott, Polly Elliott, Eliza
Elliott, Susannah Elliott & Samuel Harvey Elliott and the balance
of said Marys price in like manner to be equally divided between
John Brunson Chiberson that he now has or may have by his
wife Susannah that now has -

Item 2nd I give & bequeath to my son Wm Barnell all my wearing apparel
except my big coat which I give to my grand son John Elliott -
Item I give to my daughter Mary Wife of John Leithbertson Ten silver
Dollars to her & her heirs forever -

Item I give to my daughter Ann Elliott two feather beds & all the
furniture to them belonging with bedstead to the heirs, I give
I give & bequeath to my son John Barnell one Negro man named Derry
born the heirs, I give except every Saturday of said Derrys life I
I give to him the said Derry to do with himself as he may think
proper in an orderly way, I likewise give to my son John Barn
my grey horse named H saddle & my fire dogs, I likewise
half of my own crop that is now growing and all my cotton

Goop to him & his heirs forever

Item - I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Susannah Smart Twenty acres of Land lying on Reebon location here included in the beaverh lands off to Geo Smart which Twenty acres of land I reserved for my own use & disposal, I do further give to my Daughter Susannah Smart my Riding mare peg, the half of my Corn crop now growing to her & her heirs forever

Item. I Give & bequeath to my Grandson John Elliott a Note I have on John Deary for Twenty nine Dollars & the Interest, likewise my Chairs, Tables & all my kitchen furniture to him & his heirs forever

Item It is my will & desire, that all my stock of Hogs & Sheep together with my farming utensils & other things not mentioned if any are found shall be sold and all my just debts paid & my funeral expenses paid, and the balance of what money may be left with what I have on hand be equally divided between all my Children - and lastly I make and Ordain & appoint my John Barnett & my son in law Geo W. Smart Executors of this my last will & Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the day & year above written -

" In the name of God Amen. & May the 17th 1779 I David Bradfish of the County of Mecklenburg of the State of North Carolina (his Dardman) being very sick & to call in body and of perfect mind & memory that he be given to God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body I knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make & Ordain this to be my last will & Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hand of God that gave it hoping to find acceptance thro' the all precious Sacrifice of my Christ
