Mecklenburg State of North Carolina being of perfect mind

it is apprehended for all men once to die Do make & ordain this  
my last will & Testament the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1805 Principall  
I first of all commend my soul to God that gave it & my body  
to the grave to be buried in a decent form manner at the discre-  
tion of my executors Nothing doubting but I shall meet with  
the same at the resurrection He In the first place I allow  
all my just debts to be paid out of my estate & what pr. per  
God has been pleased to bless me with in this world to be dis-  
posed of in the following manner and form

Item I give & bequeath unto my dearly & well beloved wife  
Rosannah my bay mare commonly called Adam together  
with her saddle & bridle together with my Chest, Letters in the  
box that my wife Rosannah & myself commonly makes use of  
with all its furniture, together with the fifth part of all the  
Sheeps, furniture & the other property to be equally divided  
between my five Daughters viz Eliza, Mary, Maria, Elizabeth  
Janet & my beloved wife Rosannah my big Horse & bridle  
likewise my little pot, likewise my shooting Gun & half  
the clear Land which she remains my widow & all the other  
property mentioned to my wife Rosannah, ready to be pos-  
sessed & enjoyed as at her disposal, for ever

Item It is my will that my ageing Sister be equally divided among  
my four sons viz Robert, William, John and George the

Gives & bequeath unto my son John & Robert, William  
the one half of the plantations where I now live to be equally di-  
vided amongst the three just to be paid & enjoyed.

Item I give & bequeath the other half of said plantation unto my son  
Joseph by him freely to be paid, & enjoyed likewise I give  
Plymouth unto my son Joseph my two mares called Peacock &  
her colt freely by him to be paid, & enjoyed, and the whole  
of my property not willed to be sold & equally divided among  
the heirs, and I ordain & appoint that George Alexander  
Esq: Williamson & his my true & trusty friend & executor of  
this my last will & testament, and I do desire & pray unto  
this & no other to be my last will & testament making and  
renouncing all other wills heretofore by me made or attested  
signed sealed & delivered.

The last will of Elizabeth Berryhill the first place I

I leave & bequeath to Betty North Daughter of Joseph North  
one flaked cow & bed, with blue & white covered and one  
counterpan — I leave & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Annah  
Berryhill a new bed ticks & the others in it done sheet —

I leave to William Whitlock my son in law one dollar —  
Lastly my will is that the remainder of my property be equally  
divided in and amongst Hugh Brigham, Sam Berryhill, John  
Todd, Susannah Berryhill & Jo: North

I leave to Frederick & John Williams & their wives against Hugh Brigham &  
Joseph North — done 17th May 1788
