named Sarah; I do also give & bequeath to my grand daughter
Sarah Spencer & grand son John Spencer one Negro woman
named Linda, one Negro boy named Jack, one negro girl named
Nelly with them & Linda's future increase to them & the Heirs
of their body lawfully begotten to be equally divided at the
direction of my Executors; I also give & bequeath to my son
James Healy one Black mare, I also allow out my understand-
ing & let to my son James Healy to destroy my former charges
and Tomb Stones for mine & my deceased wife's graves, I also give
& bequeath to my son James Healy my share hood of land
I also give & bequeath to my daughter Lydia Spencer my other
youngest Heir; I give & bequeath to my wife Linda one Bed
Room with one calf also one Red two Sheds & one Blanket one
bedstead -

I also appoint my son James Healy and James Latta
my sole Executors to this my last Will & Testament resolving
nothing all former wills by me made, In Witness whereof
