Memory but calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing
it is appointed one for men to die And as touching my worldly
Estate to be with it hath pleased God to bless me with in
this World. I have & give as the same in manner following

1st I leave my wife Mary Ann Belk the plantation now known
& my negro fellow George & Rachel & the sufficiency of my stock
& house hold furniture all which I leave her to possess & enjoy
during her life as widowhood - 2nd I leave my son John Belk to
my negro fellow George & his wife Sylvia - 3rd I leave my son
Darius Belk one negro girl named Tiller & one negro girl
named Hagar & the first child that Tiller has I leave to my
Grand daughter Sarah Belk daughter of Darius Belk -

4th I leave to my Grandson James Belk one negro girl named Tomp
& one negro boy named Bill & the first child that Tomp has
I leave to James Belk's first Daughter Sarah - 5th I leave to my
Daughter Nancy Belk one negro named Charles to her & her
lawful heirs - 6th I leave my daughter Frances to my
three sons & 4th I give them to be raised out of my Estate
to buy her a negro girl - 7th I leave one hundred & twenty
Dollars to my son James Belk's children that he hath by his
lawful wife to be raised out of my Estate and Equally divided
amongst them. I also leave to my son James Belk two
hundred to be raised out of my Estate - 8th I leave to William
Belk or his lawful children begotten by my daughter
Greasy his wife Ten pounds to be raised out of my Estate if
they ever apply for it, and it not to return to the executors
or their lawful heirs. I also leave my son John Belk
one more negro named Bet Sylvia's child - I also leave
my son Darius Belk one more negro boy named little
George - I also leave my Grandson James Belk one more
negro boy named Jackson. I also will that all my lands
except the plantation now known to be the same with

estate to be divided in the same in my name, following
this word, I have Virginia with the same in my name, following

I have my wife Mary Ann Bell the plantation I now live on
& my negro fellow George & Rachel & a sufficiency of my stock
& house hold furniture all which I leave her to possess & enjoy
during her life or widowhood - 2^{dy} I have my son John Bell
my negro fellow to wish & his wife Sylvia - 3^{dy} I have my son
Darting Bell one negro girl named Tiller & one negro girl
named Wagon & the first child that Tiller has I leave to my
Grand daughter Sarah Bell daughter of Darting Bell -

I leave to my Grandson James Bell one negro girl named Tomp
& one negro boy named Will & the first child that Tomp has
I leave to James Bell's daughter Sarah - 5th I leave to my
Daughter Nancy Clarke one negro named Charles to her & her
lawful heirs - 6th I leave my daughter Frances Kontimony
three hundred & 40^{ty} dollars to be raised out of my estate
to buy her a negro girl - 7th I leave one hundred & twenty
dollars to my son James Bell's children that he hath by his
lawful wife to be raised out of my estate and equally divided
amongst them, I also leave to my son James Bell three
hundred to be raised out of my estate - 8th I leave to William
Calcut or his lawful children by gotten by my daughter
Gracey his wife ten pounds to be raised out of my estate if
they ever apply for it, and it not to return to the executor
or their lawful heirs, I also leave my son John Bell
one more negro named Bet Sylvia's child - I also leave
my son Darting Bell one more negro boy named little
George - I also leave my Grandson James Bell one more
negro boy named Jackson, I also will that all my land
except the plantation I now live on be sold together with
all the rest of my movable estate except a sufficiency for my
wife to sell and all my just debts paid, and the rest
equally divided between my Grandson James Bell and my
own sons - Darting Bell & John Bell - I also will that Peter
& his child be left with my wife during her life or widowhood

and I have old Dick on my plantation, and I desire that he be
 taken care of; I also will that the plantation that my wife
 lives on and all the household furniture & moveable effects at
 her death and Equally divided between my five children
 by name John Belk, Darling Belk, Nancy McLeod & Susan
 Montgomery & James Belk my grandson & the rest of the negro
 at her death to be appraised & equally divided between
 my five children by name John Belk, Darling Belk Nancy
 McLeod & Susan Montgomery and my grandson James
 Belk son of William Belk - - I also appoint my son
 John Belk & Darling Belk & my grandsons James Belk to
 execute my will and to take care of wife and the property
 I have here & see that she dont suffer - and now I uttering
 this, disown & disallow all other wills, Legacies wills, rights
 titles or Dowry but this and this only to be my last will &
 Testament hereunto I have set my hand this 20th day of July
 1804 In presence of us

 full use & benefit of the plantation whereon I now live with
 all the improvement & appurtenances thereto belonging during
 her life or widowhood, and it is also my last pleasure that my
 beloved wife Rachel have, hold, & truly enjoy all my personal
 estate viz my negroes, Horses, Cattle, Hogs & Sheep also all my
 growing Tobacco, Household & Kitchen furniture & all & every
 other species of property to me in any wise belonging to in full &
 undisturbed possession of her.
