Abbeville County of Mecklenburg, being there the clearest
and goodest of God, the weak in body yet of a sound
& perfect understanding, do constitute this my last
will & Testament and desire it to be revised by all as such
I do & heartily beseech my Lord to God my maker, to receive
his most gracious acceptance of it. As to my worldly estate I will
positively order that all my debts be paid; I give to my dear
loving wife for term of life this plantation wherein I now
abide with the addition of the Meadow on the Brown plan-
tation, beginning on a post Oak at the corner of Hall's Mill
field & running a straight line till it intersects with Mr. Gadd's
on Lowries Mill road, for the purpose of securing the plantation,
the family also a secure place had I running Lowries Head on it
is enclosed with the plantation. At the death of my wife

The above lands to be sold & the money to be divided equally between
my sons John, William, James & Archy Wallis & for them both of them
families to move to the Western Country that the above lands may
be sold upon condition that my sons all three & I remain alive
in as friends and for the above mentioned boys to the best of my
power and with appropriate security & further will that all the
household & kitchen furniture remain with me for the use of
the family. I also will my pistol given to my wife & also will to
my son Allison, Ten acres of land containing joining
himself & Mr. Mason & also will to the son of my son
John the use of the family until my son Samuel comes of
age that he to be heir and especially between my sons Samuel
Jefferson & Joseph according to quantity & quality or if they
so propose the lands to be sold & divided equally among them
I also will my young filly to my daughter Hannah. I will that
Samuel give Hannah a good saddle, I also will that Jefferson
give his saddle & shall have the worth one hundred dollars as soon
as soon as he comes of age. I also will that Joseph comes
of age to have a horse & also will that he & his
brother have a saddle. I also will that Joseph go to the Northern
trade in leather, brass &c against next fall, & will that
Joseph go to the Western ^{my sons} country to trade at the age of seventeen
I will that John, William, James & Wallis are sent
to traders against they can serve them & are able. I will
that my wages horses & hogs be for the support of the
family & pay the debt. I will to my son Samuel the
more I called fall — I do constitute & name Allison
& W. M. Tufts my executors of this my last will & I
Test, signed, and made for my wife & children
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& seal this 12th day of March 1822.
