In the Name of God Amen. I John Black of the County of Mecklenburg
State of North Carolina being in health 81 years now ready & desirous of making my
mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, to make & publish this my
last Will & Testament in every manner as follows.

First of all I commit my soul unto God who gave it, not out of mere
but fearing that he will receive it one day according to his word through
Jesus Christ, & my body to the church to be buried in a Christian
manner at the discretion of my executors.

Item. I leave my Quarto Land & furniture which I have not disposed of yet
to my son. It is my will that my son and wife Mary Black bear all the
household expenses till the time when we are married
and if necessary the Gray Horse, These bequests all that is yet due to
me from the estate of her son John Walker deceased, he had left
of cattle & horses which were one third of the plantation
which he had during his natural life.

Item. I leave to my son John Black the plantation which
he now lives in his dying, even different. His eyes supposed to be
two hundred & thirty having his wife never excepted during
his life & after his decease the whole land to be my son John
Black & his heirs forever by giving Hester Walker a horse
worth Sixty Dollars & my great grand daughter Martha Black
ten shillings — Item. And all the rest of my property viz
Tow hundred acres of land in the Western Territories, & property
horses, cattle or other property belonging to me of my birth
whatever may be mentioned before I shall give unto my
wife. Let it then be her way — Elizabeth — in law
Widow, William Black's children, Samuel Black, Elizabeth,
Robins, children, Augustine Walker, Margaret McAuley,
Easter Walker, &c. — And my son & Deborah Dyer said

prosperity to be sold by my Es. executors at public sale on
first credit, & all to be equally divided among my said
sons children or their heirs &c.

Fairly I hereby appoint & declare my two sons Samuel
Black & John Black my whole Executors, executors:
Selling & Realizing this my last Will & Testament
discharging & making void all other Wills &
Testaments or Testaments made by me, Abandoning and
concerning this & this only to be my last will & Testament
In witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal
this 19th day of August 1808 -

In the Name of God Amen. I Robert Buchanan of County of
Mecklenburg & State of N.C. aforesaid, being weak in body but
of sound & perfect mind humbly thank God in it's
calling to mind the mortality of my body, do make & conclude
this my last Will & Testament in writing as follows
Firstly, say first, First all my several charges & expenses
defrayed & paid out of my estate, Secondly I give & bequeath
unto my favorite wife Nancy Buchanan his last spouse
cupboard & dressers & other necessaries of the
improvement her life time; Thirdly I do also give &
bequeath unto my oldest son Charles Buchanan the
sum of one Dollar to be paid to him first of the residue of
property; Fourthly I do also give & bequeath unto my
son Robert Buchanan the sum of ten dollars to be paid
out of the Residue of property; Fifthly I do also give &
bequeath unto my son George Buchanan part of my land
lying on the north side of Shallow Creek beginning at a
post oak between us and our son, from lot 1 small rock
post to the
