

In the name of GOD Amen. This 1st day of February in the year
of our Lord 1793 I John Boyce Minister of th. Church residing
now on S. Hill river in Fauquier County in So. Carolina.
Being weakly in body, full of a sound mind & memory, and being
convinced that it is appointed for all men once to die I do hereby
constitute this to be my last will & testament.

First. I recommend my body to the dust of which it was made & my
soul to God who gave it hoping for a glorious resurrection
at the last day again I allow my self to decently buried
or burning either Cakes or liquor which shall be at the
discretion of my friends the expenses of which shall be
fully responsible to them by my executors after which I
allow all my just debts to be paid particularly those
standing against me in my own account Books
the remainder of my property together with my debts due to me
I dispose of in the following manner viz -

" I will & bequeath unto my brother David Boyer the sum of
one Silver Dollar or four Shillings & eight pence ~~sterling~~ £1 no more
likewise I bequeath to my brother James Boyer the sum of one
Silver dollar or four Shillings & eight pence ~~sterling~~ £1 no more - .
" Also I leave to my brother Robert Boyer the sum of one Silver dollar
or four Shillings & eight pence ~~sterling~~ £1 no more - .

" Again I leave & bequeath to my good friend Dr. R. G. M'Clinton
Daughter to David M'Clinton on Little River in Fauquier County
the works of Dr. John Clinton Doctor of Woolworth in six
vols also the poem entitled Conquerors Task, likewise leave
& bequeath unto her a sufficient quantity of good black
silk to make her a gown & Petticoat & also a black silk hand
kerchief which good are to be of the best quality & purchased
by my executors for her.

" I also leave to my good friend Miss Jenny M'Clinton & angular
to David M'Clinton a few mentioned the following books viz
Willwoods Glories of Glory, Thompson's Lassus and Brown's
Christian Journal. -

& bequeath unto her a sufficient quantity of good black
silk to make her a gown & Petticoat & also a black silk hand
kerchief which good are to be of the best quality & purchased
by my executors for her
I also leave to my good friend Miss Lucy McLeanston & her children
to David McLeanston aforesaid the following books viz
Willowood Glimpses of Glory, Thompson's Sermons and Brown's
Christian Journal -
Finally I leave & bequeath unto my brother William Boyer
any book that I have by me and any that I may be due me
from any of the congregations in which I was a minister or from
any other person or persons - also to my brother William Boyer
my brother William Boyer my silver Watch may be left with

Saddle & Bridle and also all my Library of Books shewing my excepted
 which were mentioned above and also my clothes of every kind on
 foot, and all other things whatsoever belong to me unto which I have
 a legal claim the whole I leave & bequeath to my son John Boggs
 I also do constitute & appoint my two other children William Boggs
 & Wm David Boggs on the waters of Roanoke river in the County
 of Surry in N^o Carolina executors of this my last will and
 Testament, and impower them to sell either a part or the whole
 of my estate after my decease as they may think best in
 order to execute this my last Will. I do by these presents
 constitute this my last Will & Testament and last遗嘱

In the name of God amen I Robert Brown being weak in

 the last day - good next I will & beg you with that all my just
 debts shall be paid; Next I will & bequeath to my brother Wm
 Brown & David Brown all my land goods & chattels together with
 trade, money & book debts equally to be divided at the discre-
 tion of my executors hereafter mentioned Executing one
 'orrel filly which I will & beg you with to my sister Margaret
 Neal I will & bequeath to Sister Elizabeth Twenty Shillings
 Next I will & bequeath to my sister Martha one hundred
 Pounds. I will & bequeath to my brother all the interest arising
 from notes & bonds during his life; and further I appoint
 James Apthorpe my executor of this my last will & testament
