


My hand & affixed my seal this ninth day of March 1777

To all Christian people whom these presents may concern  
Know ye, that John Lanor being in a weakly state of body, but  
of sound mind & memory calling to mind the Mortality of my  
body & that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do  
therefore make this my last Will & Testament & to command  
my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried in a  
Christian manner. In the execution of my Executors, G. A.S.  
having such worldly estate as God hath helped me with  
I will give & dispose of the same in the following manner  
and form.

First of all I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Martha in lieu  
of her Dower one mare called Bonny her choice of three Cows  
& all the Sheep with the whole of the Geese for the use of  
the family & Stock likewise a sufficiency of Meal for her  
& this family with the whole of the House & Kitchen furniture  
including beds & Bedding Chests &c &c with the Priviledge of  
my Mansion House and all other her uses of Office with a  
convenientable Maintenance for her & such Children as may  
live with her during her life or widowhood.

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Eleanor with  
the sum of five Shillings

Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son James Lathay  
the second choice of two & four Hogs for meat & breeding  
pigs —

weak in body, but thro' divine goodness of sound & perfect mind and  
Memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of my term in this Mortality  
w<sup>ch</sup> I thank God it is Appointed for all men once to die; Do make & ordain  
this, my last will & Testament in manner & form following, that is  
to say first & singly I recommend my now dying & immortal soul into  
the hands of my great master, hoping & trusting for the pardon of all  
my sins & acceptance thro' the merits & intercession of his dear son my  
great Redeemer Jesus Christ hoping to enjoy a place of Rest with  
him in Immortality, my body I commit to the Earth to be decently  
buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named, and as for  
what worldly effects I may leave me with dispensing in manner

I am following—

In sum I order that my just debts, funeral charges be paid & discharged  
by my executors—

Item I give & bequeath all & singular my tract of Land <sup>whereon</sup> I now live in the  
County aforesaid containing by estimation, six hundred & fifteen acres  
unto my three youngest sons Willing, Joseph & Benjamin to be equally  
divided between them according to quality at the discretion  
of my executors with the assistance of my brother Joseph Clark my  
brother & it is my will that if Providence calls either of my said  
sons out of life before they arrive to the age of Twenty one, his or her  
part is to be divided between the other two or the one that lives  
I order & my will that my executors do give unto my daughter  
Sarah when married in proportion to what my daughter charged  
for same when married—

Item I give & bequeath to my son James a certain young bay mare  
having forehead and a hind white foot—

Item I give & bequeath unto my son James one Milch cow to be delivered  
to him in my executors four years after my decease—
