Trusty friend Jacobus Wilson to be the alone Executrix of this
my last will & testament & to see that it be performed according
to the true intent & meaning hereof and I do hereby revoke &
disavow all other wills & testaments by me made, and do publish
this & declare this no other to be my last will & testament.
