2^{ndly} I have and bequeath to my Daughter Eliza the Sum of ~~Twenty~~ Twenty Shillings, and my boy Jolly to their Son John

Next to my Son James I bequeath my 40 Acres of Land and some fifty and one Hundred pounds in hard money to be paid in three years after my Decease Next I have and bequeath to Mary Hukelson One Hundred Pounds

Lastly To my son Robert I leave and bequeath the whole of my possessions, One half to his son if he has any if not the whole to himself after the death of the aforementioned Legacies in consequence of his duty to Clothing and maintaining his sister Elizabeth during her life Providing nevertheless if the said Robert does not live with by his sister, The plantation I allow to be applied to her funeral expences I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made

willing to mende the Mortality of this Body that it
is appointed for all men alive to do so Thus my
last will & Testament in manner & form following
(13) In the first place I recommend my Soul to God
to Creator and my body to the dust to be buried
after a Christian & Right manner not doubting but
they shall be reunited again by the mighty power of
God at the last day

God to bless me with I distribute in this manner (14)

Next to my son James I bequeath my Horse Mare
and some filly and one Hundred pounds in hand
money to be paid in three years after my Death
Next I have and bequeath to Mary Kirkwood one
Hundred Pounds

Lastly To my son Robert I leave and bequeath the wh
ole of my possessions, And half to his son if he any
if not the whole to himself after the death of
the aforementioned Legacies be conveyed or his li
berty clothing and maintaining his sister Elizabeth
during her life Providing maintenance of the said Robert
does not rise due by his sister, The plantation I
allow to be applied to his wife or maintaining her
I do hereby revoke all former wills by me made
inounced And declares this and no other to be my

and her that she is well supplied by John under my

of Hackensack this 19th day of January in the year of our
Lord 1785 being very sick and weak in body but of a perfect
mind and memory do make & declare this my Last will
and Testament as follows knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die it is my will & I order that at all my
Last Will and Testament expenses be paid & discharged

I have and bequeath to my Loving Mother Margarett
Cowan sixty Pounds current Money of N. Jersey to be
paid out of my Estate to her & her heirs

I have and bequeath to my beloved brother Joseph Cowan one
Hundred Pounds current Money to him or to his heirs

I have and bequeath to my Brother John Cowan son John
Thirty Pounds Sterling to be levied out of my Estate or to his
heirs as for the true execution of this my Last will and
Testament I appoint my beloved Brother Joseph Cowan
whole and sole executor. Revoking and disannulling
all wills or Testaments by me heretofore made as con-
trary and now other to be my Last will & Testament in
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the
Day and Year first above written

It hence it appears to me that I William Cowan hath, forgot
some things things that I intended I do hereby allow this
to be a part of my will who to stand and be as if it was above
written — I have and bequeath to my sister
Gannah Thirty Pounds to be paid out of my Estate to
her & her heirs I have and bequeath to my sister Mary Thirty Pounds
to be paid out of my Estate
