1796 I John Longne of Bertie County being very sick & weak in body
but of a perfect mind & memory than to be given unto God therefore, calling
unto mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed to all
men once to die, Do make & declare this my last will & Testament that is to
say, principally & first of all I give & command my soul into the hands of
God who gave it, & for my body I command it to the Earth to be buried
in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors not doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall recover the same again by the
mighty power of God; And as touching such worldly Estate which it hath
pleased God to give me in this life I give devise & dispose of in the
following manner & form -

And first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife the benefit of this
plantation which we now have on/for her benefit & the benefit of the children
with the consent of the other executors during her widowhood & likewise
the third of all my estate (lands only excepted) & I give & bequeath to her a my one of
the horse creatures that she will choose either saddle & bed & clothes and
what grain is on the plantation & the t. which is now sown I order
for the family and is not to be sold

2d I likewise leave & bequeath unto my two sons all the lands that I possess
after this manner viz to my Elizur & his wife 100 acres of this undivided
plantation & another 100 acres of undivided land forming the corner
of Lower Buffalo creek, and to my beloved son Samuel I leave & bequeath
the remainder of this Undivided plantation with the improvements which is
132 acres & the remainder of the Undivided land after my son George gets
his 100 acres off it, & likewise I leave & bequeath to my eldest son George
one thousand old Scotch pounds horn & the saddle that was his property
Brother to his wife, & likewise I leave to my son Samuel one thousand
pounds old Scotch money likewise a saddle likewise the rest of my
estate I leave & bequeath unto my seven Daughters to be equally divided
amongst them & likewise I appoint my beloved wife Mary the
same share to be my body & sole inheritor of this my last will & testament
I do witness at Bertie County NC Wills 1788-1844 unto set my hand and

man come to see, so make & declare this my last will & Testament that it is
I, principally & first of all give & command my soul into the hands of
God who gave it, & for my body I command it to the Earth to be buried
in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors not doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate which it hath

And first I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife the benefit of this
plantation which we now live on for her benefit & the benefit of the children
with the consent of the other executors during her widowhood & likewise
the third of all my estate (lands only excepted) & I give & bequeath to her my one of
the horses creatures that she will choose & her saddle & bed & clothes and
what grain is on the plantation & that which is now sowed I order
for the family and is not to be sold.

2. I likewise leave & bequeath unto my two sons all the lands that I possess
after this manner viz to my son & bequeath 100 acres of the undivided
plantation & another 100 acres of undivided land joining the river
Roan Beaufort creek, and to my beloved son Samuel I leave & bequeath
the remainder of this undivided plantation with the improvements which is
132 acres & the remainder of the undivided land after my son George gets
his 100 acres off it, I likewise leave & bequeath to my eldest son George
one thousand old Scotch pounds horn & the scoldie that was his property
Brother Williams. Likewise I leave to my son Samuel one thousand
acres old Scotch men & likewise a scoldie likewise the rest of my
estate I leave & bequeath unto my seven daughters to be equally divided
amongst them - and likewise I appoint my beloved wife Mary &
Isaac Skinner to be my body & sole executors of this my last will &
Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
