 This my last will & Testament in the manner & form following  
 viz Principally first of all, I commend my soul to God who  
 gave it, & my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like  
 & decent manner at the discretion of my executors herein after  
 named, And as touching such worldly estate as it hath at the  
 pleasured God to bestow me in this life, I give & dispose of the  
 same in the following manner—First I will that my just  
 debts & funeral charges be paid & satisfied & that as soon  
 as convenient after my decease—Item I give & bequeath  
 unto my well beloved wife Catherine the one third of the  
 profits of my Land together with the Dwelling house I now  
 live in, the Barn & other out Buildings during her life—  
 Item I give unto my son David the House I now live in with  
 the out buildings thereunto belonging together with two  
 hundred acres of land tract of land of one hundred and nine  
 acres dwelling house stands that is 200 acres that is most  
 convenient to the said Dwelling house, I likewise give unto  
 my said son David fifty acres of a tract of one hundred acre  
 of land last taken up by me that is to say 50 acres next to the  
 Dwelling house to him & his heirs forever in fee simple after  
 his mothers decease—Item I give & bequeath unto my  
 son John my old plantation containing one hundred &  
 eighty two acres to gether with fifty acres of the one hundred  
 acre tract before mentioned to him & his heirs, forever in  
 fee simple after his mothers decease, I likewise give unto  
 my son James the remaining two hundred acres of the four  
 hundred acre tract to him & his heirs, forever in fee simple  
 Item I give unto my daughter Isabella one hundred acres  
 given out of my Stock, also for the bro<sup>t</sup> G. Middle they then  
 died off, I likewise give unto my daughter Sarah wife to

convenient to the said Dwelling house, I likewise give unto  
my said son David fifty acres of a tract of one hundred acres  
of land last taken up by me that is to say 30 acres next to the  
dwelling house to him & his heirs forever in fee simple after  
his mothers decease - Item I give & bequeath unto my  
son John my old plantation containing one hundred &  
eighty two acres together with fifty acres of the one hundred  
acre tract before mentioned to him & his heirs forever in  
fee simple after his mothers decease, I likewise give unto  
my son James the remaining two hundred acres of the one  
hundred acre tract to him & his heirs forever in fee simple  
Item I give unto my daughter Isabella one hundred acres  
taken out of my Stock, her for the bros & Isabell their  
daughters, I likewise give unto my daughter Sarah wife to  
Andrew Walker, my day daughter Catherine wife to  
Stephen Gordon to each of them one acre, and likewise I give  
unto my son William & my daughter Margaret wife

Thomas Walker one Spanish Milled dollar each to be paid in twelve months after my decease if demanded  
and further it is my will that all the remainder of my  
personal estate be for the use and at the disposal of my wife  
beloved wife Catharine. And lastly it is my will that  
my son David & my son in law Thomas Walker be the executors  
of this my last will & testament, the witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of  
January anno Dom. 1794.

as God hath bestowed me with in this life I give before death and  
disposse of in the following manner viz upon my death I give to  
my just & to my loving wife Sally her Heirs & assigns forever  
three Negroes viz two boys & one girl, one boy named Sandy  
one named Sam & one girl named Polly whom I further will do  
bequeath to my beloved wife my black mare & black horse  
I give this will & bequeath to my beloved wife all the money  
Endear from Alexander Henson be it more or less, and all the  
money endear me from James Walker be it less or more  
not exceeding one hundred & fifty Dollars. The above property  
to be valued by two indifferent persons & whether it wants  
of two thousand Dollars together with the above mentioned  
Money, the balance to be made up out of what may be sold
