is dead I desire that she shall have seventy five Dollars as soon
as it can be collected after the sale. Item I desire that all the
crop now on the plantation shall be for the use of the family
except two patches mentioned to the two Girls. Item the above
named negro Girl to be left to my wife & Mary till my sons John
& Thomas come of age. And Lastly it is my desire that this my
present Codicil be annexed to & made a part of my last Will & Testament
to all intents & purposes. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this 24th day of July 1805

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In the name of God Amen. I John Davidson being sick of body
but of sound mind & memory, calling to mind the mortality of my
body, knowing that death is the wages of sin, and therefore all
must die, I therefore recommend my soul to God who gave it
hoping to receive the same again at the resurrection of the just
by the mighty power of God, My body to the earth dust to dust
to be buried as my Executors please & not estreating such
movable estate (whether land or negroes &c) as God has blessed
me with in this life I will give bequeath & convey in the follow-
ing manner & form viz

I will give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Margaret
Davidson a horse saddle & bridle, a feather bed & furniture & the
negro woman Ann & above a child, her hereafter mentioned
& the privilege of living peacefully & quietly in & on this pre-
mise during her widowhood.

Item It is my will & desire that my aged Mother be decently supported
among her children or else where at the expense of my estate
if needful but not to exceed thirty pounds current money.

Will I bequeath to my nephew William Davidson thirty pounds cur-
rent money I am here I saddle to him he is a single lawful age of 21.
I will I bequeath to each of his Brothers John & Andrew Thomas Davidson the
sum of Twenty pounds current money when the severally come to 21 years old
It is my desire I will that my Executors hereafter named do sell & dispose
of such parts of my Goods & Chattels as they judge proper & necessary and to
appraise the rest not sold. And also to do Compositions to my said wife
& Children, that they or a majority of them do sell & convey all my lands
except the Lands on which I now live, In which therefore I hereby give &
bequeath, Allen, Esq. Power & full authority unto my trusty friends Sammuel
Wilson, Thomas Davidson & William Bean Also to them their heirs
& assigns forever all those pieces parcels or tracts of Land that I am poss-
sessed of in what ever County they lie. Provided nevertheless that they
the said Sammuel, Thomas & William Bean do when they or a majority
of them judge proper to sell said lands & convey the same that they
apply the monies arising from the sales thereof as hereafter directed
and in particular that the said Sammuel & said William Bean do make
said Thomas Davidson a Deed agreeable to my sale for the Monies
of said sale --- And that the next monies arising from such sales
of Goods & Chattels & such sales of Lands & all other lawfully notes
Bonds & appraisments, &c. &c. after all just debts are paid, be divided
equally among my said wife & three Children viz. Mary, Sam Wilson
& John Thomas & their heirs, and that in case of the death of any of
said Child or Children before being of full age leaving no legal heir
of his, her or their body, that then his or her or their share or Dividend
shall descend & be applied to the Survivors or Survivor as the case
may be and as to these two tracts of Land lying in which I
live it is my wish & desire that said lands might be reserved for
my two sons to be divided by my said three male Executors equally
as they can as to value, & not confined as to quantity, but as said lands
is rather small for such a division; and to give it to one & injoin
it on him to give half its value to the other, might in the end prove
to have an unnecessary encumbrance & and as I have great confi-
dence in my said Executors &c. I do therefore hereby impower

... of my desire & will that my Executors hereafter named do sell & dispose
of such parts of my Goods & Chattels as they judge proper & necessary and to
appraise the rest not sold. And also to do ample justice to my said wife
& Children, that they or a majority of them do sell & convey all my lands
except the Parson which I now live, in which therefore I hereby give &
bequeath, Oliver, Esq. Convey & set out unto my loving friends, Samuel
Wilson, Thomas Davidson, and William Beane also and to them their heirs
& assigns forever all those pieces parcels or tracts of Land that I am here
before of in what ever County they lie. Provided nevertheless that they
the said Samuel, Thomas & William Beane do when they or a majority
of them judge proper to sell said lands & convey the same that they
apply the monies arising from the sales thereof as hereafter directed
and in particular that the said Samuel & said William Beane do make
said Thomas Davidson a Deed agreeable to my sale for the Mowison
place of 173 Acres on his the said Thomas's, saying the Debts now due
of said sale --- And that the real monies arising from such sales
of Goods & Chattels & such sales of Lands & all other accounts notes
Bonds & appraisements, &c. &c. after all just debts are paid, be divided
equally among my said wife & three Children viz. Mary, Sam Wilson
& John Beane & their heirs, and that in case of the death of any of
said Child or Children before being of full age having no legal heir
of his, her or their body, that then his or her share or Dividend
shall descend & be applied to the Survivors or Survivor as the case
may be and as to these two tracts of Land lying on which I
live it is my wish & desire that said lands might be reserved for
my two Sons to be divided by my said three male Executors equally
as they can best be valued, & not confined as to quantity, but as said lands
is rather small for such a division; and to give it to one & Benjamin
is or his to give half its value to the other, might in the end prove
to have an unnecessary encumbrance & and as I have great confi-
dence in my said Executors &c. I do therefore hereby empower
them to make such necessary provisions & repairs to the said house
so as to make it useful & beneficial &c. & after the decease of my said
wife or after her widowhood, that if my said Executors, Samuel
Thomas & William Beane do then find & judge it to be for the ad-
vantage

Advantage of my said two Sons to sell the said lands, building
improvements, that they then are hereby fully empowered to sell
& convey the same as fully & amply as the before divided lands. And
that they divide & apply the real monies arising therefrom (after
deducting said repairs & finishing of said House) equally between
my said Sons when they begin to have a legal age, but if there is but
one of them alive, & no more of the Body of the said deceased then their
Father shall have the one third of said real monies and the surviv-
ing Brother the remaining two thirds.

And lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my said
Wife & Margaret Davidson & my faithful friends Samuel
Wilson, Thomas Davidson & William Beane Alexander to be my whole
& sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament, here by revoking all
former Wills, Gifts or bequests either by word or writing Decla-
ring & confirming this & no other to be my last Will & Testament
And forever hereafter holding for firm & effectual all & every act
& thing which my Executors may do in the Premises &c.

by the said John Davidson as his last Will & Testament who

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In the name of God Amen. This 9th day of December 1799
I James Dunn of the State of Carolina, of a free & sober
mind, being of perfect mind & memory, do hereby give
unto God, therefore calling to mind the mortality of
my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do hereby declare this my last Will & Testament. That is to say
principally & first of all, I give & recommend my soul and
the hands of the Almighty God unto him, & my body I
recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian
