Frederick Denkins now lies to him & his heirs forever.

I give to my grandsons William H Smith & John D Smith four  
negroes viz Judith & her child, David son of Sylvia & big Jenny  
after the death of my wife to them & their heirs forever.

Further more it is my will that all & every part of my estate  
not herein mentioned to be sold at the discretion of my Execut  
and the money arising from such sale be equally divided  
among my three sons James, Frederick & Joshua, my three  
Daughters Martha Hendrick, Mary Smith & Peggy Henderson  
My two grandsons William H Smith & John D Smith to have  
one share between them of said property. Also my two grand  
Daughters Polly & Victoria Hobart one equal share between  
them, Also the whole of the property lent to my wife (except  
big Jenny) to be divided in like manner.

Moreover it is my will that whatever money may be in  
my possession at my decease that one third of it be given to  
my wife the other two thirds to be divided as the last Article  
mentions.

I appoint & declare my beloved wife Polly Denkins Executrix  
& my son James Denkins & my son in law John Hendrick Executors  
of this my last Will & Testament, revoking & disannulling all others  
but this & this only In witness whereof I have hereunto set my

after the death of my wife to them & their Heirs forever.  
Furthermore it is my will that all & every part of my estate  
not herein mentioned to be sold at the discretion of my Execut  
and the money arising from such sale be equally divided  
among my three Sons James, Frederick & Joshua, my three  
Daughters & Martha Hendrick, Mary Smith & Dolly Henderson  
my two Grandsons William H Smith & John D Smith to have  
an share between them of said property. Also my two Grand  
Daughters Polly & Victoria Roberts one equal share between  
them, Also the whole of the property lent to my wife (except)  
big Jerry, be divided in like manner.

Moreover it is my will that whatever Money may be in  
my possession at my decease that one third of it be given to  
my wife the other two thirds to be divided as the last Article  
mentions.
