Joseph willed above my negro woman Sarah to her & her heirs forever
and I declare this will is the alteration to be my last will and
as to witness my hand & seal this 31 May 1810.

In the name of God amen. I James Doster resident on Duckabough
Island Creek Levee, County State of Louisiana, being at present in
sound health & of a sound disposing mind & body by God's favoring my
thought much abated thro' age & calling to mind the decree of
Heaven that it is appointed unto all men once to die, and that there
may be no difficulty in dispensing of temporaries after my death
I do make & ordain this my last will & testament in the manner
and form following. — Likewise do I recommend my soul to
God who gave it, and my body to the Earth where it done to be
buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my
successors hereinafter named — And as touching such worldly
estate as it hath pleased the Almighty to bless me with, I give &
dispose of the same as follows — First I will that all my just
debts & funeral expenses be paid as soon as can be after my decease —
I give & bequeath unto my affectionate beloved wife Sarah all the
land that remains to me after what I have given to my other children
being the plantation on which I now live with all its buildings
& improvements the full & undisturbed possession of which to be
held during the term of her natural life also I will to my wife —
granted all the necessary tools & utensils with all the household and
kitchen furniture also one year's provisions for herself & her de-
scendant only excepted, and further I give & bequeath unto my wife
equivalent to her of cattle with their increase from the present time
the being the increase of cattle which were hers before we were

Murid, and I give unto her son head of Hogg say a Boston
to Court & other Streets, with these in excesse commonly known by
the name of Lordys hogg -

44 My will is that my son Andrew continue to live with his mother
till he work the plantation until he comes of age, and to have a sufficient
part of the same. If he is able to work he must work for his own
living but if he is not able to work he must be supported out of
the above mentioned property the whole term of his mothers life
and after his mothers decease my will is that all which may
remain of what I have given to his mother be given to him my
said son Andrew as kept for his use & support at the discretion
of my executors -

45 It is my will that my clothing & wearing apparel be equally
divided between my sons Thomas, Jack, William & Oberl -
46 My will is that all the property which may remain, which
is not herein otherwise disposed of with whatever money
may be in hand at the time of my decease be divided without
a sale if can be done equally best if not then let it
be sold and out of the money arising from the sale let five
acres... be given to my son Jack & two thirds of the remainder
be given to my son Thomas and the remaining one third to
be equally divided between my son Oberl & my daughter Oberl
Thomas - And lastly I do nominate constable & appoint
my son Sampson to be sole Executor of this my last will &
testament hereby revoking all former wills by me here
before made & Ratifying & confirming this to be my last will
& testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & affixed my seal this 17th day of August in the year
of our Lord 1816.
