 I in the first place do bequeath my soul to God that gave it
 and my body to the dust, and as to my worldly effects, I do bequeath
 to my son Joseph Edwards five shillings Sterling. & to Dauglath Jane
 five shillings Sterling, & to my son Griffy five shilling Sterling
 and to my daughter Elizabeth five shillings Sterling. & to my
 daughter Catherine five shillings Sterling, and to my wife before
 her I do bequeath one more & last & two cows & to be kept up
 & her bed & bedding of clothes & the household furniture, and to be at
 her disposal at her death & a sufficient maintenance off the
 plantations, and to my son John I do bequeath my plantation
 House, barns, sheep & p'son & all Husbandry Utensils to his
 heirs & assigns, known Proprietary Edwards Esqre & his
 Heirs & assigns

In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Elliott being of sound mind
 & memory, but in a low state of health, recollecting to mind that it is ap-
 pointed for all men once to die. I now make & declare this my last Will
 & Testament, and in the first place I do commit my soul into the
 hands of God that gave it, in expectation of a glorious resurrec-
 tion at the great day of Judgment. As to my body I commit it
 to the dust from whence it was taken to be buried at the
 discretion of my executors herein after named in Christian maner.
 Item. It is my will that my beloved wife Chapman have bid & furnish a saddle
 & bridle where shef an ame of flax & all her apparel & two Prover-
 bial dishes & a spittoon & a butter box.

Item. It is my will & pleasure to give & bequeath unto my son Joseph
 Elliott all my weareing apparel & tract or part of land lying
 in South Carolina on Bullards creek containing one hundred
 & fifty acres of the land more or less to be sold by my
 executors at publick vendue & all the rest of my moveable
 & immoveable estate I bequeath it to
