" In the Name of God Amen. John Hargrove of the County of Northumberland
being very sick & weak, but of perfect mind & memory therefore I give
unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body & knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die. Do make & ordain this my
last will & Testament. That is to say principally & first of all I give &
recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that you will
& my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent
Christian manner. Nothing doubting but at the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of
God. And as touching such worldly estate where with it has
pleased God to bless me in this life I give & dispose of the same
to Sarah Hargrove my beloved wife to be freely enjoyed by her
during her life & after her decease to fall to my son Benjamin
Hargrove & his heirs forever. No witness I have of these words
my hand & seal this 26th day of August 1795
