In the name of God Amen. I John Hersey of the County of Middlesex
State of N^o Carolina, being weak in body but of a perfect mind and
memory & calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
appointed for all men once to die, I do hereby constitute & appoint
as my last Will & Testament in the manner & form as follows. And
that all I recommend my body to the Earth to be buried in a decent
Christian like manner at the discretion of my wife & children. It was
to my worldly estate wherein it hath pleased God to bless me with

in this life & give & dispose of the same in the following manner
 Nam - First of all it is my will that all my lawfull debts may
 be paid, & it is my will that the following property shall be sold
 at public sale to discharge said debts Viz Sixty acres bearing
 John River, two Wagons with the land grants & forty acres bearing
 Daniel Robinson, & three head of horses, & the Mill & all the Dishes be
 belonging to said Mill with all my hogs except one sow & pigs, I allow
 to my wife & all my cattle Except one choice cow & all my property
 & otherwise I allow her goods to be sold, I allow her with all
 my book accounts to go to pay my debts, & there be any re-
 mainder after my debts is paid, I allow my daughter Susan a
 to have ten Dollars to purchase her a Saddle & then the Remainder
 due to be equally divided between her & all the remainder of all my
 children following my wife to have an equal part with them
 And, further it is my will that all my part that is coming to me
 at my Mothers death shall be equally divided among my wife
 & children, & further it is my will & pleasure that my beloved
 wife Elizabeth shall have all my household & Kitchen furniture
 of every kind, & further it is my will that my wife Elizabeth shall
 have one young sow & one black colt I brought from Willm.
 Price to work the plantation with, together with two pair of Gees
 two plows & the hoes & further it is my desire that my wife
 Elizabeth shall have the plantation I now live on during her
 widowhood to raise my children & school them, & if my wife
 should marry, I allow her but the one third of the Land & that only
 for her life time & if my wife marry I allow the children to
 have the two thirds of the plantation at her marriage & at her
 death I allow the land to be equally divided among all my children
 & unto I do hereby constitute & appoint my two sons & Master &
 Peterman to be my sole executors to this my last will & Testament
 Duly signing this & no other to be my last will & Testament, & for this
 it is my will that my wife shall allow her grand daughter Susy
 & her husband Harry to have ten Dollars in 1000 whereof
 said John Hussey and hath hereunto set his hand & affixed my seal
 This 20 day of February in the year of our Lord 1821 -

John Herk, late Waggons with the land gives & forty acres forming
Daniel Robison's three head of horses, & the Still & all the effects be-
longing to said still with all my hogs except one sow & pigs. I allow
to my wife & all my cattle except one horse & all my property
Hitherto I allow all my horses to be sold, I allow them with all
my boats accounts to go to pay my debts, & if there be any re-
mainder after my debts is paid, I allow my daughter Susanah
to have ten Dollars to purchase her a Saddle & then the remain-
der to be equally divided between her & all the remainder of all my
children following my wife is now unequal, part with them
and, further it is my will that all my part that is coming to me
at my Mothers death shall be equally divided among my wife
& children, & further it is my will & pleasure that my beloved
wife Elizabeth shall have all my household & kitchen furniture
of every kind, & further it is my will that my wife Elizabeth shd
have one young sow & two black colt I brought from Willm

In writing this & no other to be my last will & testament,
it is my will that my wife shall allow her grand daughter Susanah
the land her to have ten Dollars in 100th parts whereof
said John Herk my son hath agreed to set his hand & affixed my seal
this 20 day of February in the year of our Lord 1821. —
who is the sum of 115 & one in the hundred of each other
