In the name of God Amen. I John Huggins of the County of
Northumberland & Province of New Carolina being at this time of
perfect health & sound mind & disposing memory & being
now enlisted in the Service of this province in order to quell the
Rebels & Rebellion now raised against the Government by the
people called regulators & not knowing how soon it may please
God to call me out of this life, either by the hands of the common
Enemy, or by divine providence, Do therefore make & declare
this to be my last Will & Testament, As my worldly substance
whereunto God has been pleased to bless me with, I will devise
& bequeath in manner & form following that is to say
Impressure. I will that my beloved wife Barbara have possession
my dwelling house & plantation during her widowhood in order
to support her & three children now living with her untill they
marry or come of age according to the different sex & in case my
said wife should marry, I will that she have one third part of
lands or one third part of the neat yearly profits during her life
& in case of her death or her untill marriage again, I will that my
Executors do sell & dispose of my land in the best manner they
can & that the money arising, from the sale to be equally to be divided
between my children in general by even & equal portions first
to my son John who is a Cripple, to whom I give five pence
more than any of the rest, & in order to pay my just debts & dis
charges, I will that all my moveable estate be sold by my
Executors at public sale & the money arising thereupon to be divided
in like manner, that is to say one third to my said wife and
remaining part to be equally divided among the children.

I devise & give my son Jacob, one Strawberry man three years old
 having formerly him that fifty -- And I do hereby nominate & con-
 stitute my loving friend Paul Barringer Esq & Barbara Hayler my
 lawful wife to be my Executors of this my Last Will & Testament.
 Notifying & confirming this & no other to be my last Will, Revoking
 & annulling all former & former Wills heretofore by me made
 or devised, In Testimony whereof I do hereunto set my hand &
 Affix my Seal at Salisbury in New an County this 24th day of May 1778
 signed, sealed, Declared & pronounced by the said John Hayler
 in presence of us who in his presence & at his request

 earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Exors
 nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive
 the same reunited to my Soul by the mighty power of God. And
 touching such worldly goods as God hath been pleased to bless me
 with in this life, I give devise & bequeath the same in the fol-
 lowing manner & form -- first I allow all my lawful debts
 to be paid -- Secondly I give & bequeath to my eldest daughter
Martha five Shillings Sterling, Thirdly I bequeath to said Martha
 eldest daughter James Harris twenty five pounds proce to be paid
 her as soon as she is married, & also I bequeath to the above
Martha second son Charles Edward Harris twenty five pounds
 proce to be paid him as soon as he comes of age -- & I give & bequeath
 to my eldest son Robert all that tract of land lying
