

Christian Era 1816 I John Hipworth of the State of New Carolina & County of Mecklenburg being of sound mind knowing that it is appointed in all men to die, Do declare that my earthly estate be disposed of in the manner & form following, I direct my after appointed Executor to have my body a Decent Buriall — Item I Will & bequeath to my daughter Henry Catharine one Year Old Horse colt —

Item I Will & bequeath to my daughter Sally Hipworth one horse mare one pair of Drawers two beds with their usual furniture to her & her heirs, Also it is my will & desire that Sally have the Use of a part of my dwelling house sufficient to contain the furniture now by with her for herself when attending to her common & necessary housewife while she remains in single life — Item I Will & bequeath to my son John

Hipworth the plantation or tract of land whereon I now live, also one black horse named hooter, one bed & the usual furniture to him & his heirs — I Will & direct that the Grain, Forge & mill including one fat Hog at present on my farm remain for the support of my children Sally & John — Should they continue to live as one family but on separating to different places of residence the grain Forge & mill to be equally divided & each have one share

I Will & direct that the remainder of my Estate including the Corn & wheat at present in the care of Mr. John Means be sold at public vendue on a one month credit & the money applyed to the payment of all just debts & on a final settle ment of my Estate the remainder to be for the use of my children Sally & John — Lastly I constitute & appoint Hugh Park to be Executor of this my last Will & Testament until my son John Hipworth arrives to the age of Twenty one Year — then it is my Will & I do hereby constitute my son John Hipworth my sole Executor, directing my first appointed Executor to transfer the whole business to my last appointed one, provided always that if any suits in law be at issue & undetermined Respecting my Estate, then in that case my first appointed Executor will continue to act during such law suits, & finally, I do hereby revoke & make void all former Wills or Testaments by me made.
