28 December the 2^d day 1790 I John Houston being in a
 clear condition, but in a sound mind & memory, do make this my
 will & Testament, In the name of God amen, I commit my body
 dust & my soul to God that gave it, as to my worldly substance
 First I allow all my debts to be paid & funeral expenses, I do give
 & bequeath my land & Tenements & my clothes to my brother John
 Houston, I will & bequeath to my sister Elizabeth my little
 mare to be for her support for by her equal share with the
 of my sister, and likewise my York horse is to be content
 upon the place for the service of my Mother & Brother, & I do give
 all the rest of my Goods & Chattels to be sold & equally
 among my five sisters.
