


die before her Husband James Boyce without issue then the said Will & her Children shall be to the use of the said James Boyce during his life but my daughter shall have full authority to dispose of them to whom soever she may think fit. — Item I will bequeath the widow daughter Rebecca a negro Girl named Emma & her issue if any during her life and to her children after her decease. — Item I will bequeath to my Grand daughter ^{Susanna Thompson Boyce} Alice & her Husband Briddle, a cow & calfs the Horse & Saddle to valued at an hundred Dollars also I will unto her the negro Child Betty after my wife's decease, and it is noted that my son Hugh furnish the Horse & Saddle & cow & help out of his part of the Estate — — Item I will to my Grand daughter Rosa Edeline Boyce the female Negro child which the negro woman heretofore had, & which my — Daughter Susanna now possesseth. — Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Chargent & Sons Thomas & Hugh executors to Presidents of this my last will & testament, Herby witnessing to the same calling all others herebefore made conspiracy this to be my last will & testament the witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 28th day of Jan 1806

2. In the name of God Amen. I John Kinnaird of the County of Middlesex
& State of Carolina, being in a low state of health & but of perfect mind
knowing, thanks be given to Almighty God, calling to mind the mortality
of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make & execute this my last will & testament, that is to say
first I give & bequeath my soul into the hand of Almighty
God that gave it, and my body I command to be buried
in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors, nothing
hereafter, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God, now at ^{the} thinking back to a dying
state and to a spirit of God restore me in this life again and
dispossession of the same in a sojourning manner; and first I will that
all my just debts be paid together with all my funeral charges

summons at her disposal while she remains in his widowhood, also
 will & bequeath to my loving wife two of her choice of the cattle farm.
 I also will to my wife Elizabeth one third of the land the improved
 part thereof during her widowhood, in consequence of her marriage
 this third part I will to return & in connection with the other two
 thirds to be divided in six equal shares between my six boys my
 wife during my widowhood whatever property she is possessed of I will
 to be equally divided between my children. I also will to my wife
 one dark Sorrel Mare late by name to be hers forever with her ~~old~~
 Saddle. — Then I will bequeath to my loving son James Kennerie
 one Stud horse & his Saddle & Bridle valued at forty dollars also
 Forty dollars to come out of the Cotton Crop also a sow & pigs that
 he claims — Then I will bequeath to my son Jacob Kennerie one
 dark Chestnut Sorrel Horse also his Saddle Rated at one hundred
 dollars also one sow & pigs that he claims — Then I will to my
 two daughters Margret Kennerie & Jennette Kennerie Fifty dollars each
 Then I will bequeath to my sons sons Ez. William Kennerie and
Samuel Kennerie & Robert Kennerie & Joseph Kennerie Fifty dollars each
 all of which monies I will to raised from the sale of my property
 that is not bequeathed if any is wanting to make up said monies I
 will that it be made up out of the Cotton Crop — Then I will
 that all the grain the wheat & the corn be kept for the use of
 the family & stock. I also will that one bushel Corn & six bags that is
 mentioned by Jim Gowen Person here that is to be left to be kept
 for the use of the family. I also will that the Geese shall be at the
 disposal of my loving wife & in the care of my family etc —
 This is my last will & testament I acknowledge by witness
 where up I have hereunto signed my mark & joined my seal this

18th day of July 1816
