Item I will & bequeath to my Grand ^{Jennett Mathews Boyce} daughter the Horse & Saddle & bridle, a bow & half the Horse & Saddle to be valued at an hundred Dollars, also I will unto her the negro child Betty after my wife's decease, and it is willed that my son Hugh furnish the Horse & Saddle bow & half out of his part of the Estate. Item I wille to my Grand daughter Ann Adeline Boyce the sum of negro child which the negro woman Bet now has, & which my Daughter Jennett now possesses. Lastly, I do hereby constitute & appoint my wife Margaret & sons Thomas & Hugh Executors & Executors of this my last will & Testament, hereby requiring & desiring all others herebefore made confirming this to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 28th day of Jan 1806

In the name of God Amen. I John Kinnier of the County of Northumberland & State of Carolina, being in a lawful state of health but of perfect mind & memory, Thanks be given to Almighty God, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed in all men once to die, Do make & declare this my last will & Testament, that is to say first I recommend my soul into the hand of Almighty God that gives it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bestow on me in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner; and first, I will that all my Estate &c &c be sold together with all my personal effects

furniture at her disposal while she remains in her widowhood, I also
 will & bequeath to my loving wife two of her choice of the cattle for use
 I also will to my wife Elizabeth one third of the land she improved
 part thereof during her widowhood, in consequence of her Marriage
 this third part I will to return & in connection with the other two
 thirds to be divided in six equal shares betwixt my six boys my
 wife during my widowhood whatever property she is possessed of I will
 to be equally divided betwixt my children, I also will to my wife
 one dark sorrel mare Gate by name to be hers for ever with her
 saddle. — Then I will & bequeath to my loving son James Kenner
 one third horse Colt his saddle & bridle valued at sixty dollars also
 forty dollars to come out of the Cotton Crop, also a sow & pigs that
 he claims — then I will & bequeath to my son John Kenner one
 dark Chesnut sorrel horse also his saddle valued at one hundred
 dollars, also one sow & pigs that he claims — Then I will to my
 two daughters Margaret Kenner & Jennett Kenner fifty dollars each
 Then I will & bequeath to my four sons viz. William Kenner and
 Samuel Kenner & Robert Kenner & Joseph Kenner fifty dollars each
 all of which monies I will to raise from the sale of my property
 that is not bequeathed & if any is wanting to make up said monies I
 will that it be made up out of the Cotton Crop; — then I will
 that all the grain the wheat & the corn be kept for the use of
 the family & stock, I also will that one bush Corn & six bags that is
 nominatly viz. five Gallow harrrows & one that is to be cut to be kept
 for the use of the family, I also will that the Grass shall be at the
 disposal of my loving wife & for the use of my family &c. —

 18th day of July 1816
