20 In the name of God Amen. I John Kirkpatrick of the State of North Carolina. No standing County being weak in body & thinking it probable that God may soon remove me from this life think proper that while my Judgment remains & my memory perfect to dispose of my property as follows - I desire I will that all my lawful debts be paid out of my Estate -

Item. I will & bequeath unto my beloved wife Margaret a negro woman named Milly & her child Violet to her & her heirs forever also a negro child named Betty during her natural life, also all my household & kitchen furniture to her & her heirs & also all my outstanding debts after all my debts are paid. Also I will that my son Hugh Kirkpatrick keep one horse & two cows for her use on the plantation I own here, the room to the East end of the House during her life, also that he supply her annually with forty bushels of Corn & ten of wheat for her maintenance during her life also that he furnish her with an acre of land for her business on whatever part of the plantation she may make choice during her life -

Item I will & bequeath unto my daughter Jennet a negro woman named Bet & her three oldest children during her life & her the full power to dispose to whom she pleases at her death, but provided it should so happen in Providence that she should die before her husband William Witherspoon in that case the said negro woman & children shall be to the use of the said Witherspoon during his natural life, & at his death the said Bet & her children shall be the property of John Deasmond the son of my daughter Jennet & to him & his heirs &c.

Item. I will & bequeath to my son Thomas the negro boy named Jack which he has now in his possession.

Item. I will & bequeath unto my son Hugh Kirkpatrick all my land which I now possess, all my farming utensils one wagon & gear,

half of all my Stock of Horses & Cattle except what may hereafter or has
before been mentioned also my negro Jack & Jim to him his heirs & assigns
I will & bequeath to my Daughter Anne a negro woman named Nell &
her children during the Term of her natural life, and provided she should
die before her Husband James Boyce without issue then the said Nell &
her children shall be to the use of the said James Boyce during his life
but my daughter shall have full authority to dispose of them to whom
soever she may think fit. — Item, I will & bequeath unto my daughter
Margaret a negro Girl named Emma & her issue if any during her life
and to her children after her decease. — Item I will & bequeath to
my Grand daughter ^{Jennett Wythe} ~~the Horse & Saddle~~ ^{the Horse & Saddle} & bridle, a low & calfs the Horse &
Saddle to value at an hundred Dollars, also I will unto her the negro
child Betty after my wife's decease, and it is noted that my son Hugh
furnish the Horse & Saddle & cow & calf out of his part of the Estate —
Item I will to my Grand daughter Anna Edeline Boyce the fourth
negro child which the negro woman Bet now has, & which my
Daughter Jennett now possesses. — Lastly, I do hereby constitute
& appoint my wife Chargeant & sons Thomas & Hugh Executors &
Executrices of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking &
canceling all others heretofore made confirming this to be my
last will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto affixed
my hand & seal this 28th day of Jan 1806
