the same by the mighty power of God, here as touching such worldly
estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life. I give
and make & declare of the same in the following manner & form.

First, of all I give & bequeath to my beloved sons, James Kneeland & Joseph Kneeland
to them both know all & comprehend my real estate of land & buildings containing four
hundred & eight acres by estimation to be greatly divided according
to the quantity & quality of the said premises always observing
by my will that my beloved son James Kneeland is to have his first choice
in such divided lands & processes him, beloved son Joseph Kneeland
is second choice, & if any of my beloved sons die before they come
at the age of Maturity then in such case my will is that his part
of the division of land shall devolve & fall to my beloved son Joseph Kneeland
but if all my sons deceased till to the age of Maturity then in
such case the proprietors of said lands are to have an equal & party
division of said estate in lands to my beloved son Joseph Kneeland to
be determined when he comes to the age of maturity.

All I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Sarah Kneeland two cows
two calves, a heifer, two Sheep, a grey Mare four years old, with a
foal & four colts, & one Child of my estate.

Then I give & bequeath to my beloved son John Kneeland a half of my estate
then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Kneeland two cows three
calves, two Sheep & a black Mare four years old, a half of my estate
then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Kneeland two
calves, two Sheep of my estate.

Then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Anne Kneeland two cows
two calves, two Sheep of my estate.

Then I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Jean Kneeland all my lib-
& tient & living for the maintenance & education & schooling

of the body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do
make & declare in this my last will & testament, that is to say, further

one black, a heifer, two sheep, & five hens from years old, with a
red & white & piebald Calf of my estate -
Then I give & bequeath to my beloved son John two cows & half of eight
cows I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary two cows & two
sheep & black mare from years old, & half the value of my estate
then I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth two cows
two calves, two sheep of my estate -
Then, I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Anne Hart two cows
two calves, two sheep of my estate -
Then, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Anna Kinn all my like
that are not lying for the maintenance & clothing & keeping
the children as she shall think proper & likewise the waggon
plantation tools & the rest of the house not before settled

before others to remain & be as they were or with the rest of the executors to be removed at his disposal for the same over as long as she remains single or unmarried & then over a hour after her own sudden & total separation. This is said primarily & particularly to be distributed as she shall think proper.

Lastly I do nominate Captain & appoint my beloved Brother Samuel Knox the like named friend Hugh Weston sole Executor of this my last will & Testament till & during my lands messages & documents to be justly Executed & I likewise appoint her children Wilson & James Boyce as Guardians for the Children. And I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul all & every other former Testaments, wills, legacies, bequests & executors by me in any wise before named willed & bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament.
