which I now live during her life a widowhood.

I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son William Haffet
all this tract of Land on which I now live the property
to be transferred to him at the death or marriage of his
Mother as the law may be: Him It is my further will
& pleasure that my Negroes shall have my other moveable
estate be sold by my Executors and of the money thence
arising after all my just debts are paid the two thirds
thereof to be equally divided among my other children
viz. John Haffet, Jane Haffet, Rachel Haffet and
Robert Haffet And I do hereby appoint my said
wife Charlotte Haffet & my Brother Robert Haffet to be my
whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills, Gifts & legacies Relying
on my Confining this & no other to be my last Will & Testa-
ment, Sealed with my seal & dated this 11th day of
June in the year of our Lord 1775.
