33 In the name of God Amen. 26th September in the Year of our Lord 1785. I John McKimmon of the County of York in the State of Virginia, being weak in body, but of perfect sound & disposing mind & memory, 'Alas! be God!' & calling to remembrance the transitoriness of this life & that it is appointed for all men once to die; I make & declare in this my last will & testament in manner & form following: My will & desire is that all my just debts & funeral charges be lawfully & fully paid by my executors hereafter named.

Item My will & desire is that after my decease my Executors do pay to my deceased brother Hugh McKimmon's daughter Sally in Pennsylvania a young Negro, or one hundred pounds Current Money of Carolina. The choice to be optional with the Legatee if she is of her majority sufficient to make it for her best interest, if she is not, my desire is that it be made in favor of it by my Executors to which Legatee is to be her use & benefit forever.

Item My further will & desire is that my beloved wife Jane McKimmon do have as comfortable & genteel & sufficient living off of the plantation whereon I now live as it will admit of during her natural life & after her decease to go to the use hereafter directed, also I give & bequeath to my dear wife the Negro named which & a young woman named to be called to be the first & second of my said wife during her natural life or change of widowhood & home & after the first dissolution that shall take place by either of two ways

Then those above mentioned negroes to be distributed as hereafter directed
 I do allow my said wife two thirds the third sum above clearing
 her life & her own man saddle & bridle, all his wearing apparel, together
 with two cows & calves, the choice of which, I allow my said wife & her
 & those entirely last mentioned to be to her use benefit & disposal for ever —
 Item after my wife's decease I give & devise to my brother James McCallister (who
 I expect is now in the Kingdom of Ireland) the tract of land between
 now being containing by estimation 300 acres, also a negro boy named
 Mark who is with the land to be to the use & benefit of my said brother
 & his heirs forever; And if he should incline to come to America, my
 will is that the part I have bequeathed & devised to him be equally
 divided, or given to my then surviving children. Item My further
 will is that the remainder or residue of my estate which
 will consist of negroes including of those mentioned to my wife 100 acres
 land joining to Mansford & McCallister together with every kind of
 stock I have now in my possession & a right to claim & all other my
 moveable property to be sold and after discharging all my just debts
 the balance or remainder together with those two negroes to be given
 & devised to my wife with their increase (if any) I give & bequeath in the
 following manner; My wife now being in the situation of pregnancy
 if it please God to deliver her a safe deliverance & the child live to the
 age of maturity, & is a male child I allow him the two thirds of my
 clear estate & the remaining one third I give to my daughter Hannah
 McCallister to be to both their uses & benefits forever, but if my wife
 should be delivered of a female child & it arrives to full age in that case
 I allow an equal division in my clear estate to take place between
 it & my said daughter Hannah & to take them & each of their heirs lawfully
 begotten for ever — Further & Lastly, I do hereby constitute constitute
 & appoint my Thomas Harris & James Harris both of the County of
 Carroll in the State of Carolina together with the David Gordon of York County in
 South Carolina my whole & sole Executors of this my last will & testament,
 hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made in this respect
 whereby I have heretofore set my hand & the date of year above written
 signed sealed published & declared by the testator to be his
 last will & testament in presence of

Others lately last mentioned to be taken up himself & disposed for ever —
I give & devise to my Brother James McCutcheon (who
I expect is now in the Kingdom of Ireland) the tract of land between &
now lies containing by estimation 300 acres, also a negro slave named
Nash who is with the land to be to the use & benefit of my said brother
his heirs forever; but if he should incline to come to America, my
will is that the said I have bequeathed & devised to him be equally
divided or given to my then surviving children. Item My further
will is that the remainder or residue of my estate which
will consist of Negroes exclusive of those mentioned to my wife MD acres
land joining at Mansford & W. C. Mellican together with every kind of
stock I have now in my possession & a right to claim & all other my
movable property to be sold and after discharging all my just debts
the balance or remainder together with those now negroes to be in-
vested to my wife with their increase (if any) I give & bequeath in the
following manner; My wife now being in the situation of pregnancy
if it please God to bless her a safe delivery & the child live to the
age of maturity, it is a male child I allow him the two thirds of my
clear estate & the remaining one third I give to my daughter Hannah
& McCutcheon to be to both their uses & benefits forever, but if my wife
should be delivered of a female child & it arrives to full age in that case
I allow an equal division in my clear estate to take place between
it & my said Daughter Hannah & to be to them & each of their heirs (especially
begetten for ever) — Further & Lastly, I do hereby constitute constitute
& appoint (May) Thomas Harris & James Harris both of the County

South Carolina my whole & sole Executors of this my last will & testament,

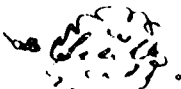

I William McRee of the above County & State make this my last
will & testament, & I do hereby revoke & disannul all other wills
heretofore made. My I commit my body to the earth, & my
soul to God who gave it, trusting in his mercy thro' Jesus Christ
for pardon & acceptance with him - and as to my temporal
estate my will is that my wife Dianah have all that house-
hold which she may think necessary for her own use & the
disposal of it at her death & a sufficient maintenance
by my son Andrew McRee during the time, & that if it
should be the case that she be the survivor that he pay
a strict regard to that matter; I will to my son John
McRee to be paid to him by my son Andrew as soon as
may be convenient a Slaveable young Negro or the price
of such an one according to the Judgment of William Polk
& James Tazewell Esq^r & Robert Allison - Lastly I will to
my son Andrew McRee the plantation on which I live
