 of the Society of Friends being in perfect health
 mind & memory, but calling to mind the mortality of my body, that it is
 appointed for all men once to die, & because I have sinners, first of all
 I commend my soul into the hands of my most Merciful Creator & then
 it me nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive it
 by the mighty power of God, & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
 in a decent manner, and first of all it is my will to dispose of the same
 with me to be laid to rest in the place God to bless me with here on this earth
 in a manner & place following: first of all I order & it is my will that all
 my just debts & funeral charges be paid ———— & it is my will that my
