 & commend my soul into the hands of my most Merciful Creator Jesus
 at me nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive it
 by the mighty power of God, & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
 in a decent manner, and first of all it is my will to dispose of the same
 in the following manner, I do hereby give & bequeath to my wife
 my first estate & personal charges to witte ———— & it is my will that she
 with her own & wife's help should have for living on the plantation that

Should charge to him by his self it is my will that my ^{largest} being
wield be a ^{glorious} house & supply him in all the necessities ^{to mind} the

by virtue of my duty it is my will that my son John pay unto my
son Joseph the sum of fifty pounds. them I leave & bequeath unto
my well beloved son Robert part of my body cloth & at at
them I leave & bequeath unto my well beloved son James my blue cloth
them I leave & bequeath unto my well beloved son David at at
them I leave & bequeath unto my well beloved David at at
one saddle hee back & back cloth, body cloth, wheel & fifty pounds
them I leave & bequeath unto my Grandson John to my son James at
pounds. them I leave & bequeath unto my Grandson John to my son
in law ten pounds. I leave & bequeath unto my Granddaughter Martha
daughter of Christian ten pounds. them I leave & bequeath unto
my Grand daughter Martha daughter to David at at
pounds. And all the rest of my estate I leave in the hands of my son
& fifty pounds of that money to be at the discretion of my wife at
in death in case she lives a widow her natural life, & if she
should happen to change her life that fifty pounds with the rest
of that money that is left in the hands of my executors to be dispo-
sitioned the rest of my legacies as the executors shall think proper.
And I do authorize & approve my well beloved wife at at
son James to be whole & sole executors of this my last will & testam-
& do hereby disannul all other wills made by me heretofore either
in word or writing & declare this to be my last will & testamen-
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand the day
year above written.
