my said wife that then such Child or Children shall be equally
divided amongst my three youngest Children before mentioned
and that at their mother's decease, I further leave unto my daughter
Joseph a parcel more land of one year old, likewise I leave unto
my two Grandsons William & David Brown sons to my daughter
Margaret such cattle as has been nominated as theirs already
I likewise give unto my sons Andrew, David & James & my
daughters Hannah, Margaret Brown & Elizabeth wife to
Solomon Springfield to each of them the sum of five shillings
to be paid to each of them Twelve months after my decease if
demanded. And Lastly, I do nominate & appoint my well
beloved wife Elizabeth executrix & my son Joseph Executor of this my
last will & Testament, hereby revoking other wills by me heretofore
made, ratifying & confirming this to be my last will & Testament.
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
this 4th day of August in the Year 1793.

reclaim this my last will & Testament. That is to say principally
& first of all I give & recommend my soul into the hand of

Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate to which it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give & devise & dispose of the same in the following manner & form -

First I give & bequeath to & sell my dearly beloved wife her last & lawful & one third of all the moveable property during her natural life & my dwelling house & all her appurtenances to be the property of my son George & the remainder of all my real & personal property to be equally divided among my three sons Isaac Isaac Isaac & George, only to my son Richard I leave five shillings Sterling, & to my son James & his son John all my body clothes, all the property to be equally divided by the Executors & two free holders chosen by my Executors - I likewise constitute make & ordain to be my Executors William Hill & James Curry to be the Executors of this my last will & Testament. And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul all & every other former Testaments, wills, Legacies, bequest & Executors by me in anywise before named will & bequeathment. Ratifying & confirming this to be my last will & Testament. Witness before of I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 26th day of February in the Year of our Lord 1795 -
