Item I do will & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Polk's negro woman named Suckey with her child that is not born & a Dwarkey increase, a horse called Bowlin saddle and bridle two cows, to young cattle, a feather bed & furniture. Item I do will to my beloved daughter Polly I bequeath a negro woman called Dot, a feather bed & furniture. Item I bequeath a child of which my wife is now pregnant, I bequeath a negro boy called Hampton, also a feather bed & furniture. Item I do will then all other property of mine such as horses cattle & Hogs, Household furniture, farming tools, to be sold at auction & the proceeds of sale with the interest until my children become of age to choose guardians to be equally divided between my wife & children above mentioned.

Item I do will & bequeath unto my Mother Polly Bennett for this year only, as much corn & provisions as will support her & her stock, also one bushel of cotton of common weight to follow the sowing on each acre. Item I bequeath unto my wife & children a new Miller a set of Hatters tools - And I have by constatute foregoing my friend Jerry Poole & my wife Mary Polk the executors of this my last will & testament.  Beatty to them these Heirs Executors & signors, however in trust never
 to sell, that the said James Wilson & William Beatty do sell at
 public sale or otherwise as they or their Heirs or Executors may
 judge best to enhance the price thereof & by the whole of the lands
 I am now possessed of & collecting the same improvements thereon
 to make ready; in the same &c. which also I hereby will be
 bequeath that the said James Wilson & William Beatty as my
 Executors do sell at Public sale all my goods & chattels beyond the
 sum of monies herein arising from the sale of the said lands of
 203 acres & other monies in hand & monies due or becoming due
 by me & go out of all which my said Executors shall pay the
 executors & debts over trifling debts may be due fr. me more
 than the rest residue shall be divided & paid in the following
 manner & form; Item viz an equal division among all my brother
 & sisters children who are living & if any one or more are dead to come
 to his heirs. All which division shall include the executors
William Beatty & Holsey Wallis & Robert Hyatt & his sister Mary Parker
 daughter of Elizabeth Hyatt & B. the above goods & chattels are
