& first of all, I give & recommend my soul into hands of Almighty
God that care it & my body I recommend to the earth to be
buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors
nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive
the same again by the mighty power of God that is to say
such W. J. J. estate mine with it to be blessed God to bless
me on this life, I give Demise & disposition of the same in the following
manner & form — First, I give & bequeath to my
beloved wife the plantation whereon I live
together with two work Horses & a pair of gears her saddle
& her wheel & her bed & her 13 dishes & furs her. Thereunto belong
my land her paper & all her household furniture & also her
6 cows & calves on my plantation & her one Negro Girl
that is now in my plantation & her Negro woman named Dinah
that is now in my plantation & her one Negro Girl that is
now in my plantation & all my sheep all what I at last I give to my
beloved wife during her widowhood, & after her decease
the said articles to be in possession of my son — Now I give &
bequeath to my beloved son Robert Patterson one hundred & thirty
four acres of land at or near the last Survey of the same to be
situated there where it is most convenient to me & that at
my death or the next I give to my son Robert Patterson
the above said Negro fellow named George Young & his wife

the plantation he now lives on known by the name of
Fesperous place & at his mother's marriage or decease I give to my be-
loved son Alexander Patten my own Negro a bench named Dina, & one
young Negro Girl named Nancy & the plantation I now live on & my
wage on & years to be on the plantation, for the use of the family -
Also I give to my beloved grand daughter Elizabeth Lawrence one bay Horse
now on my plantation named Toby said to be sold by my parents & that
many rising from the sale of said to be kept on Langlet's Island for the
use of Jack Elizabeth Lawrence till she is come of age - And I also
1 Give & bequeath to my beloved Grand son John Patten one hundred acres
of Decided land to be so received by my Executors of the within and of the ad-
juring that I now live on with the improvement that is belonging to said
hundred acres of land & as better improvements to this improvement as may be
convenient by some which need no more of Decided land. I do hereby in-
vocate of my Executors, as I said John Patten will no come to the age
of thirty & then to be given into his hand with present title and
during his life, & at his decease to descend to his, and his heirs
no more at my Executors, as I said John Patten will no come to the age

& one Negro Girl named Nancy - I do also give bequeath to my beloved
grand daughter Elizabeth Lawrence & also to the Rest my Daughter
within children the sum of three hundred pounds money each to be
paid out of my Estate - I do also give to my beloved grand daughter
Elizabeth Lawrence the sum of my own children & within the term of three years
have the money to be paid out of my Estate - I do also give bequeath
to my beloved Grand son John Patten the sum of three hundred pounds
to be paid out of my Estate - I do also give to Elizabeth Lawrence one
own own out of my Estate - Also I give to the Cross head Negro
said the rest of my Estate after my lawful debts & several charges is paid
I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Lawrence with children and widow & at her
death as Mar. as to be equally divided between my two sons Patrick
& John Patten - I do also give bequeath to my beloved
Grand son John Patten & worthy friend Philip my beloved
son

Robert & John Andrew Patterson the sole Executors of this my last will & Testament, And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke & disannul all & every other, former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, Bequests & Executions before in any wise before or since written & signed with Myself, my & confirm-
 ing this & no other is my last will & Testament. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 16th day of
 October in the year of our Lord 1786.

 & John Andrew Patterson to be equally divided between them.
