Year of our Lord 1787. I John Fletcher of the County of Me-
lton being sick & unable to speak but of perfect mind and
memory, do make and give my last will and Testament calling to mind
the Mortality of my body, & fearing my natural appointed
all men over to die. Do make & declare this my last will and
Testament; That is to say Principally & first of all I
recommend my soul to the hands of God that gave it, & my
body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian
like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors not
doubting but at the General resurrection I shall rise in
same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching
such worldly Estate where with God hath pleased to bless me
in this life I give, devise & dispose of the same in the follow-
ing manner & form Imprimis It is my will & do desire
that in the first place all my just debts & general charge
in paid & satisfied, Item I give & bequeath to Jane my beloved
wife one Sella horse & saddle & bridle & panniers, as to my
Land & Stock & whatever else I possess I leave the use of them
to my wife & children in order to raise those that is young
during her widowhood or death, but if they (my son and
hereafter named) should think fit for the familys advantage
to sell the Land & the other effects sooner they may & so
at the value of the whole Estate be equally divided among
my wife & children my sons William & John & daughter
Elizabeth I except from any part of the division only one
Shilling each, my beloved wife Jane & my son David I
constitute & make & ordain my only sole Executrix of
this my last will & Testament, and do by this my will inclose
therewith all power & right & title in me lies to give a
Legal title to the land when sold. I do hereby positively
disavow & disown all other will or Testament
before this by me made & confirm this done & no & then
witness before of whom hereunto set my hand & seal the day
of Jan: above written sign sealed & proclaimed by me "John
Fletcher" as my last will & Testament on the presence of us the
witnesses Samuel Davis John Fletcher

as Justice for said County. Samuel Davidson & Nathaniel
Worrell being duly sworn deponeth & saith that being in
company with Elijah Ryan some time before he went to
North Carolina being sensible of his Mortality, & of course
short of memory, did in their presence & requesting them to
witness if he did not return alone he did bid all allow
Joseph Maxwell to inherit all his Cloaths & other effects
sworn to & subscribed by said Depoent this 15th day of
August 1789 in presence of Samuel Davidson

However Thomas C. H. Clegg being duly sworn deponeth
& saith that Elijah Ryan in less than hour before his
death told said deponent that he told them of his
neighbours that he would have come back
of that allowed Joseph Maxwell to get an estate
being small that he had sworn to & subscribed this
24th day of October 1789 before

In the name of God amen. December the tenth 1785 I John
Simpell of Chester County & province of North Carolina
Being sick & in my latter end do appoint & declare
this my last will & Testament, last first of all I give to
Brennan my son unto God Almighty that gave it to my
body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent
Christian burial at the discretion of my son nothing doubt-
ing but at the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God. Touching such worldly
estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life I
give & dispose of the same in the following manner & form
and first I give & bequeath to my daughter Margret fifty
pounds Sterling money to be paid her & divided out of my estate
& also to have till her old age. Next I give my land to my son
to be possessed by him only my daughter is to have for life.
