

a saddle, three things, to be given to him when they come of age, & I give & bequeath to my two sons Joseph & John the plantation where to own him containing two hundred acres to be joint tenancy to be equally divided between them when they both come of age, not without leaving the land to be subject to the maintenance of the two sons during their minority and after that my three youngest children to be educated by the profits arising from my farm back settlement as may be thought proper by my executors — I ordain & appoint my well beloved friend Mary Green & my wife to be my executors of this my last will & testament & there be it disannulled all other wills & legacies that might have been made by me & published & pronounced this to be my last will & testament & no other as witness my hand this 23rd day of June 1806. — signed in the presence of
