 in my private senses & knowing that I am appointed over, or all to die
 in the first place I constitute & appoint this to be my last will
 & last will & testament & no other - Therefore I recommend my
 soul into the hands of the Lord God who gave it. Secondly
 my body to the earth from whence it came - I also appoint
 Mr Benjamin Beathus & Josiah Harrison my Executors: & in
 the first place I leave a list of my sundry accounts & them to be
 paid my wife with there what part of property may be
 necessary for salary with a note of \$5 dollars bearing interest
 I give & bequeath to my wife all my household furniture
 two cows & calves, beds & bedding, my breeding mare & colts
 I give & bequeath to my son William Salter the young mare &
 saddle & bridle he being just turned of 4 years I would
 wish him bound to Mr Scott Blacksmith should the crop
 pay the rest & debt I desire that Mr Mills note may be paid
 & put to interest for William or as the Executors may see cause
 not being able to write I recommend my little family to the
 care of the Lord of Heaven where I hope we may meet forever
 unto God's bless. & prosper you & lay & bring up your
 children in the knowledge & fear of the Lord acknowledge
 before God & their two witnesses that this is my last will
 and for the within mentioned - In Witness I have set
 my hand & seal this day & year before mentioned
