In the name of God Amen I John Thompson of the County of Meck  
Loring in the State of N Carolina being in a poor condition but in  
perfect mind & memory therefore that it is apprehended for all  
men known to me to die make & declare this my last will & testament  
that it being principally first of all I give & command my soul  
to God I do give it & my body to the earth to be buried in Christian  
Burial at the discretion of my executors And for such worldly  
estate wherewithal I have received from God to bestow on me I give  
& bequeath & dispose of in the following manner —  
I give & bequeath my estate real & personal to my three  
brothers Lester and they are to divide it as they please — I also  
constitute & appoint my beloved brother William Thompson  
as my executor to this my last will & testament signed sealed &  
proclaimed this 10<sup>th</sup> day April 1790.

In the name of God Amen March the 8<sup>th</sup> 1800 I John Taylor of  
the County of Mecklenburg & State of N Carolina being very sick  
but of perfect mind & memory thank be to God I do make & declare my  
last will & testament First I command my soul to God that you  
have hopes of acceptance through Jesus Christ & my body to the dust  
and as to my worldly property I will & devise it in the following  
manner I will that all my just debts & funeral debts that I owe to  
any be paid & within a reasonable time after my death —  
I give & bequeath to Margaret my beloved wife a comfortable main  
tenance off this my farm & the half of this my dwelling house as  
long as she remains my widow I also will to my wife one negro  
girl called Neddy one negro boy called Samson I also will to my  
wife a young sorrel mare & her saddle & Bridle I also will to my wife  
a book called Bart's Navigation for the same — I give & bequeath  
to Margaret my daughter one negro woman Sarah their young  
child called Israel & also will to my Margaret one negro boy

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More named Ribbons & his Saddle & bridle, and I will the said  
Chapman a bed & other harness & its furniture — I give & bequeath  
to my son Abraham one tract of land that I purchased from Hugh  
Biggarn which contains by Survey 128 acres, I also will to my  
son Abraham one negro man named Charon & one negro woman called Siddy  
I will to the said Abraham one cattle first yearling colt called his  
and my Saddle & bridle — I will & bequeath to my son John  
that tract of land that I purchased from Samuel Givens which  
contains by Survey 158 acres together with a tract of 89 acres that  
I purchased from James W. Lee, I also will to my son John one  
negro boy called Moses I also will to John the value of a boy that  
is called Habibut, I will to John one boy mare colt that is  
called his & a new saddle when he comes to the age eighteen  
& bridle to be raised out of the remainder of my estate —

I will & bequeath to my son James that tract of land that I pur-  
chased from Thomas Spence containing by Survey 990 acres, I also  
will to my son James one negro boy called London, I will to  
the said James another negro boy called Habibut, I also will to  
James one horse named Bob & a new saddle & bridle to him  
at the age of eighteen — I give & bequeath to my son William  
Barnett & to my son Archibald Armstrong this tract that I now have  
in which contains 281 acres together with two other tracts one  
that lies joining <sup>this tract</sup> of 18 acres that I purchased from Hugh  
Biggarn & the other of 100 acres that lies joining Peterich Burd  
& Lees & Wilsons land, I will that the whole of the before described  
land that is not before willed be equally divided between the said  
William and Archibald — I will unto my son William  
one negro boy called Paris & one negro girl called Phillis, &  
I also will to William one horse mare called the old bay, I will  
to the said William & a new saddle & bridle to be given to  
him at the age of eighteen out of the remainder of my estate —

I give & bequeath unto my son Archibald one negro woman called Piggy  
her youngest child, I will to the said Archibald one  
horse or sixty dollars in cash, I also will to the said Archibald a  
new saddle to be given to him at the age of eighteen out of the  
remainder of my estate — And all my body clothes I will to be equally

Bigham which contains by Survey 128 acres, I also will to my son Abraham one negro named Caesar from Negro woman called Siddy  
I will to the said Abraham one colt just yearling colt called his  
and my Saddle & bridle — I will & bequeath to my son John  
that tract of land that I purchased from Samuel Givens which  
contains by Survey 158 acres together with a tract of 89 acres that  
I purchased from James Mc Kee, I also will to my son John one  
negro boy call'd Moses I also will to John the value of a boy that  
is called Hartout, I will to John one boy mare colt that is  
called his & a new saddle & bridle to be given to the age eighteen  
& bridle to be raised out of the remainder of my estate —

I will & bequeath to my son James that tract of land that I pur-  
chased from Thomas Spence containing by Survey 930 acres, I also  
will to my son James my negro boy called London, I will to  
the said James another negro boy called Hartout, I also will to  
James one horse named Bob & a new saddle & bridle to him  
at the age of eighteen — I give & bequeath to my son William  
Barnett & to my son Archibald Armstrong this tract that I now live  
on which contains 281 acres together with two other tracts one  
that lies joining <sup>to the west</sup> one of 18 acres that I purchased from Hugh  
Biggs & the other of 100 acres that lies joining Robert Woods  
& Lees & Wilsons land, I will that the whole of the before described  
land that is not before willed be equally divided between the said  
William and Archibald — I will unto my son William  
one negro boy called Paris & one negro girl called Phillie, &  
I also will to William one boy mare called the old bay, I will  
to the said William & a new saddle & bridle to be given to  
him at the age of eighteen out of the remainder of my estate —

I give & bequeath unto my son Archibald one negro woman called Pige  
her youngest child call'd Sam I will to the said Archibald one  
horse or sixty dollars in cash, I also will to the said Archibald a  
new saddle to be given to him at the age of eighteen out of the  
remainder of my estate, And all my body cloth, I will to be equally  
divided amongst my sons, I will that there shall be kept a suffi-  
cient quantity of all things necessary for house keeping & carrying on the  
farm be valued for the use of my family whilst they do live in it

family, especially but when a separation becomes necessary I will that  
they be resolved & equally divided — I give & bequeath to my two sons  
viz Abram & John one tract of land which contains 900 acres it lies  
on the waters Potts creek in Lincoln County so to be equally divided  
between them both — I will to my son James one tract of land containing  
900 acres lying on the waters of Indian creek in Lincoln County —  
I also will one tract of land that I purchased called part of Giles old  
place together with 20 acres that lies joining former aforesaid lands  
to be equally divided between my two sons viz Abram, John, James  
William & Christopher — I also will that Abram & John is for to have  
one years schooling out of the remains of my Estate — I will that  
James & William shall have two years schooling out of the remains  
of my Estate — I also will that Christopher & William have three years  
schooling to be raised out of the remains of my Estate —  
I give & bequeath to each of my sons viz Abram, John, James  
William & Christopher one good bed & furniture for the same to get  
them when the come of age for to be taken out of the remains of  
my Estate

I also will that two Horses shall be kept for the use of the farm  
viz one Horse called Dick & the other called Diamond — I will  
that the whole of my Hogs shall be kept for the use of my family —  
I will that all the other perishable property which may not be necessary  
for the before mentioned purposes that I have not willed be sold &  
the money equally divided amongst my legatees — I appoint —  
James Scott Junr. & Margaret my wife & John McDowell my  
executors of this my last will & testament as witness my hand and  
seal the day & year first above written
