Living wife Eleanor Parker Sixty pounds proclamation money of
North Carolina in eighteen months by the very clearest & likewise a good
written bed & furniture immediately after my departure. Then I give
& bequeath to my Eldest son Joseph Parker, fifty Pounds proclamation
Money of North Carolina in 18 months after my decease likewise
a black horse six years old with a Star in his forehead a rifle gun
blow horn & Trinklings immediately after my Exit. Then I give &
bequeath to my son Samuel Parker Fifty & two pounds proclamation
Money of North Carolina in 18 months after my departure likewise
one Peacock three years old immediately after my Exit likewise
blow horn & Trinklings. Then I give & bequeath my Daughter Hannah
Parker fifty pounds proclamation Money of North Carolina in eighteen
months of the my departure from this world likewise a good bed and
furniture & a horse saddle & bridle the horse of Ten pounds per year or Ten
pounds instead of said Horse. The remainder doth itt Order my executors
to sell to the best advantage all my Estate both real & personal in order
to discharge all just debts, funeral charges & all the legacies or legacies
as also in mentioned & the remainder if any of my Estate both real &
personal to be equally divided between my two sons above mentioned
whom I do also appoint, direct & therefore my heirs before to
Trusty Friends Eleanor Parker my beloved wife Joseph Parker my
son the witness of this my last Will & Testament. Odeobring and
discharging all former Wills & Testaments that I have made unto
publickly declare & openly profess this to be my last Will & Testament
& the true intent & meaning there of be known hereunto set
my hand & seal my self this 6th day of July 1767.

In the name of God the Father, I John Taylor, ~~of~~ County of
Hickory, 4 Miles. of Charlotte, being in a sick & low condition
& in a state fit to be got of a sound disposing mind & perfect

1st I hereby do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner
of form following vizt At my will is that all my just debts be paid
and I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Taylor my negro boy
name William to her & her heirs forever & also I will her having on the
plantation hereon give her her natural life -
2^d My will is that my negro boy Moses shall the butt among my per-
sonal property be kept on my farm as it now is for the use of my
beloved wife & children has the care to the best to used their children
of said property I direct that my Executor have the property so
left to be valued by three Appraisers then to be divided in as many
shares as there are Legatees (my Daughter Caroline McNight excepted)
& the Heir so residing their portions to given them & the Butt to be
return in common Stock & then passed in the same manner as di-
rected above so on through^t whole of the Legatees but if the negro
boy Moses shant prove dis obedient or refractory I direct my Executor
to sell the negro & horses & put his price in common Stock as directed above
& I furthermore direct my Executor to sell all the Buttens of my
negroes not specified above & I give & bequeath to my two sons
James Lee & John Marion Taylor the Plantation whereon now lies
containing 285 acres & also my tract of 100 acres lying above the
creek meeting house joining the land of James Read all the
others - 3rd I will & bequeath to my Daughters Jane Gardner
McNight, Martha Dow, Mary S. Eliza H. Veney &
all the land in Tinsake County & in order that it may
be Equally divided I furthermore & direct my Executor
to sell the said Land & make an equal division among
all them & unto them & lastly I nominate & appoint
my beloved wife Mary Taylor & my trusty friend John Hunt to be my
Executor & Executor to this my last Will & Testament this 19th day
of January in the year of our Lord 1830 in witness wherefore
I have set my hand & seal in presence of
