I give & bequeath my Estate real & personal to my three Brothers & Sister and they are to divide it as they please - I also constitute & appoint my beloved brother William Thompson as my Executor to this my last Will & Testament, Signed, Sealed & pronounced this 10<sup>th</sup> day April 1790.

In the name of God Amen March the 8<sup>th</sup> 1800 I John Taylor of the County of Chickadee & State of N Carolina being very sick but of perfect mind & memory Thanks be to God I declare this my last Will & Testament, First I commend my soul to God that gave it in hopes of acceptance through Jesus Christ, & my body to the dust And as to my worldly property I will & devise it in the following manner I will that all my just debts I owe be paid that I owe to my best friend as within a reasonable time after my decease - I give & bequeath to Margaret my beloved wife a comfortable maintenance off this my farm & the help of this my dwelling house as long as she remains my widow, I also will to my wife one negro girl called Rhoda & one negro boy called Sammey, I also will to my wife a young sorrel mare & one saddle & bridle, I also will to my wife a bed called bed & furniture for the same - I give & bequeath to Margaret my daughter one negro woman Sarah & her young girl called Sarah & I also will to my Margaret one young boy
