 bequeath unto my daughter Jane Hacy fifty dollars
 if my Estate will admit after my lawful debts
 are all paid if not one dollar, I leave & bequeath
 to my daughter Marys children one dollar, --
 I leave & bequeath unto my son Robert Walker one
 dollar, Then I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas
Walker whom I likewise constitute make and
 hold me my sole Executor of this my last Will &
 Testament all & singular my Land & Meyscages
 & Tenements, Goods & Chattels by him freely to be
 possessed & enjoyed; And I do hereby utterly
 disallow revoke & disannul all & every other
 former Testament, Will, Legacies & Bequests and
 Executors by me in anywise before named Willed &
 bequeathed: Attestifying & confirming this & no other
 to be my last Will & Testament in Writings whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal This 8th day
 in the year of our Lord 1804 - Signed sealed pub-
