friends my brother Matthew Wallace & my son Matthew  
W. Wallace to execute this my last will & testament.  
Given under my hand & seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1824 - signed sealed & acknowledged.

Chesterfield in the State of N. Carolina being in a low  
State of Health, but of sound mind & memory & under  
a strong prescience of God for the same, Do make this my  
last will & testament in the manner & following  
Viz P. I. My will & desire is that I be decently buried -

Also my just debts & funeral expenses be paid  
P. This my will that my beloved wife Rachel be taken  
particular care of by my two sons Willm & Joseph.  
Whileshe lives & that she have the disposal of her bed  
sheet & Clothing etc. I give & bequeath to my son  
James my red Cow & her Calf, also one fourth part of  
my Hogs & Sheep. &c. I give & bequeath unto my daughter  
Elizabeth Knox one dollar with whatever else I may.

have given her formerly. 5<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath unto my son William one half my land my Loam & Chicklings including Birds & Fishes & one fourth part of my Sheep & Hogs, my large pot & weasing Bottles, Bone small tank  
 6<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my son Joseph one half of my land (& the land shall be so divided between William & Joseph -  
 that the houses they now occupy shall stand on their own lots,) also my red Cedar Home & south part of my Sheep & Hogs, my large Captured or striped by themselves I allow for William & Joseph, ~~but~~ <sup>and</sup> by their & nothing less than  
 I allow for William & Joseph & son Madge. 7<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath my son Samuel one dollar. 8<sup>th</sup> I give & bequeath to my grandson Samuel Whiteside the  
 Balance of my property viz my bay Horse Dobson & Hackle one black Horse two yearling Bulls &  
 one year old heifer my lame Captured Horses three  
 one Table, Book case & books one fourth part of my  
 Sheep & Hogs one large flock there, one flock Pigs, one  
 small Horse, pot rack, pot hooks & something else  
 one Bridled, bad & unstrung, one bone Shovel, Tidy, one  
 Skillet, one bacon from pot. This is all my slaves  
 take place immediately I allow my Stock of provisions  
 on hand to be divided equally between my sons -  
 William & Joseph, but I hereby nominate & appoint  
 my son Joseph Whiteside to my trusty friend John  
 Hart my executors of this my last will & testament -  
 hereby revoking & making void all & every will or wills  
 by me at any time heretofore made & to declare this to be  
 my last will & testament, the witness whereof I the said John  
 Whiteside have hereunto set my hand this 1<sup>st</sup> day of  
 March 1824. signed sealed & delivered by
