In the name of God amen This 11th day of May in the
Year of our Lord 1795 I John Wilson of the County of
Chesterfield in the State of Virginia being sick &
weak in body but of sound mind & memory Thanks be to
God & nothing to mind my Mortality & that it is appointed
for all men to die Do make this my last will & Testament
first of Recommanding my soul to God who gave it
my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian
decent manner hoping through the merits Death &
Resurrection of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ to receive a
free & sole pardon of all my sins & to inherit everlasting
life; and touching such worldly estate as God hath
granted me with in this life I give & bequeath
in the following manner viz It is my will that all
those debts that I may be bound & satisfied by my Executor
here after named Him I give & bequeath to come into
William Wilson the plantation wherein I live when as
same excepting the half of the brick house the rest of my
Negro slave during his life & the two fields next Thomas
Martins & at his death the said brick & fields to return
to William Wilson my half brother & his heirs & assigns forever
Him I give & bequeath to my sister daughter Rebecca
Henderson a young man from four to seven to be
Hire forever Him I give & bequeath to my sister Margaret
slavery like a boy one Negro two years old and one

Lamb and is her Hins; person, Item I give & bequeath
 to my Brother James's Daughter Mary one Cow & half
 & to her Hins person - Item I give & bequeath to my Negro
 Plum the half of my Bedstead with the use of the two
 fields next to Thomas Hartley during his natural life
 & at his decease to return to my Brother William Hins
 as before mentioned It also leave to the said Plum
 one Black Mare Seven Years Old with one foal &
 Tasklings with my Bedstead & half Wall my every
 day clothes which Negro Hartley set free from all
 servitude as a Slave & the above bedstead to be at his
 own disposal with a robe & Habit not before thought
 on one year old with one lace Lamb, with six hds
 of bags of his own choosing, with two pds, One book
 & two blankets to him & his wife no person

Item I give & bequeath to Margaret Wilson my step mother
 my Located Home /one Sheet & one robe & Habit & to her Hins
 person - Item It is my will & I order that the residuum
 part of my Estate be made sale of for defraying my De-
 bts & funeral expenses, and if any sum should remain
 be it less or more I give & bequeath the same to Jonathan
 Potts daughter Mary & to her Hins - Item I give &
 bequeath to Plum one falling Cow from weding has
 Item I name, nominate & appoint my brother James
Wilson & my trusty friend John Davidson merchant
 my executors having due consulting eng before made
 & attesting & confirming this & no other to be my
 last will & Testament.

June 15th 1795 For some reasons not before thought on I John Wilson now think proper to make a small alteration in my last will of bequeathing my land lying in the County of Buck which land in my will was left to John but is set aside as will be seen in said will.
 Item I give & bequeath first over unto my brother David
 my brother Samuel my sister Mary's son John Potts
 & my sister Margaret son John the above mentioned land
 lying in the County of Buck to be equally divided
 among the three mentioned persons & to them
 Heirs & espairs forever Item I give & bequeath to my
 step Mother one red Heifer one year old which
 Heifer was mentioned to Plaintiff - signed by John
 Wilson as a part of his will in presence
 of Margaret Wilson &
 Will Graham } John Wilson.

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Wilson
 of Monktonbury County State of Maryland
 being sick of body but perfect in mind & memory
 do think it duty at this time to make this
 my last will & Testament in the way & manner
 now following viz I bequeath my soul to God
 who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be decent
 ly interred as my executors should think fit
 And with regard to my worldly effects I will
 dispose of them in this way & manner following viz
 one hundred & six silver dollars which I have at
 this time to go to paying my debts, one hundred
 & thirty acres of land in contract one tract of 450
 acres, one Black Mare saddle & bridle, also £4.5.-
 due me from John Stark, for house work done to
 him, one note of Thirty two pounds due from
