 to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die, Do make & Ordain this
 my last will & Testament, that is to say principally & first
 of all, I give my soul into the hand of God who gave it & my
 body to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian man
 & no nothing doubting but at the Resurrection I shall receive them
 again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly
 Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life. I do
 dispose of the same in the following manner & form —

1st I give to my well beloved wife Dicy the plantation whereon
 I now live with two house creatures two cows & calves, two
 horses & pigs, two feather beds & furniture with her choice of two
 ploughs & one pair of gears these things I give her during her
 life there to be sold at 12 months credit & equally divided
 between all my heirs my son Jeremiah Worham except I
 may for him to have the part of it; 2dly I give & bequeath
 to my son Jeremiah Worham fifty shillings legacy —

3dly I allow all my land & property except what I have
 already willed to my wife & my son Jeremiah to be sold at
 twelve months credit by my Executor which I shall have
 after name & my just debts paid out of it & the difference to be
 equally between my son Boies & my daughter Mollie my
 son Miles, my son William, my son Branch, my son George my
 daughter Nancy, my daughter Dicy. Lastly to constitute
 & appoint John Harris Esquire & Thomas Barnett Executrix
 of this my last will & Testament, and I revoke & disannul
 all former wills & Testaments by me made to be void & this
 only to be my last will & Testament in writing whereby
 I have caused to be my hand & seal the day and
 year above written —

all the household Table & Kitchen furniture except
as here after mentioned, also one half of what is in his
my sonson Williams hands, also half of the value
of my Ware which is to be sold, also all the Cloth &
Yarn now in the house or making. Item I will be
bequeath to my daughter Lilly my Saddle, 2 dog
plates to be her choice & one fourth of the value of my
nega Girl. Item I will bequeath to my son William
Wilson one fourth of the price of my nego girl, one half
of what is in his & Roberts hands, one counterpane one
little sheet & over some half of the price of wear to be
sold as apaysd; Item I will bequeath to my grand
Daughters Charity McDaniel & Piggy Lomax one bed &
furniture to each the best Bed & Ward furniture to go
together to be picked & regulated by my daughter Lilly
& to be kept by her for them until they need them
Item I will bequeath to my grand Daughters
