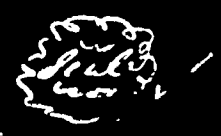


In the name of God Amen. This 26th day of June 1801
 I John Worsham being sick & weak in body but of
 perfect mind & memory thanks be to God for it's calling
 to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die, Do make & Declain this
 my last will & Testament, that is to say principally & first
 of all, I give my soul into the hand of God who gave it & my
 body to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian man-
 ner nothing doubting but at the Resurrection I shall receive them
 again by the mighty power of God, And as touching such worldly
 Estate as it has pleased God to bestow on me in this life, I do
 dispose of the same in the following manner & force —
 1st I give to my well beloved wife Daisy the plantation whereon
 I now live with two horse creatures two Cows & Hens, two
 sows & pigs, two feather beds & furniture with her choice of two
 plows & two pair of gears these things I give her during her
 life then to be sold at 12 months credit & equally divided
 between all my heirs my son Jeremiah Worsham excepted I
 empower him to have no part of it; 2nd I give & bequeath
 to my son Jeremiah Worsham fifty shillings currency —
 3rd I allow all my land & property except what I have
 already willed to my wife & my son Jeremiah to be sold at
 twelve months credit by my Executors which I shall here-
 after name & my just debts paid out of it & the balance to be
 equally between my son Reuben & my daughter Whitely my
 son Michl, my son William, my son Branch, my son James my
 daughter Nancy, my daughter Daisy. Lastly to constitute
 & appoint John Harris Esquire & Thomas Barnett Esquire
 of this my last will & Testament, And I revoke & disannul
 all former wills & Testaments by me made to be void & this
 only to be my last will & Testament in writing whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this day and
 year above written —

W^m Wilsons Will as by declaration one hour before his death.
Imprimis I will give & bequeath to my son Robert Wilson my negro
girl promised he pays Charity Connor, William Wilson & Lilly
Connor each of them one fourth of the value of said negro
which said valuation is to be appraised by Jos^{ph} McNeill, Thos^{as}
& Hugh Torrance or James Connor. Item I also will be-
queath to my son Robert my best bed & furniture viz
one pair of blankets, one covered, 2 counterpane &
sheets to be picked by my daughter Lilly Connor, also
all the household table & kitchen furniture except
as here after mentioned, also one half of what is in his
& my sonson Williams hands, also half of the value
of my mare which is to be sold also all the cloth &
yarn now in the house or making. Item I will be-
queath to my daughter Lilly my saddle, 2 a dog
plate to be her choice & one fourth of the value of my
negro girls. Item I will bequeath to my son William
Wilson one fourth of the price of my negro girls, one half
of what is in his & Roberts hands, one counterpane one
little blanket one & one half of the price of mare to be
sold as aforesaid; Item I will bequeath to my Grand
Daughters Charity McConnell & Peggy Connor one bed &
furniture to each the best bed & worst furniture to go
together to be picked & regulated by my daughter Lilly
& to be kept by her for them while they need them
Item I will bequeath to my Grand Daughter
