charge of my Estate, he to be furnished in two suits of
clothes including the horse above mentioned & freedom
specified in his indenture unless said death and the
circumstances thereupon mentioned should happen
within one year of his freedom by Law; then & in that
case I will that he receive his full freedom (the horse still
excepted) — Item I do here by constitute & appoint my
beloved wife Elizabeth the Sole Executrix of this my last
will & Testament all & singular my Debts & moveable
effects to dispose of the same in form aforesaid & finally
I do hereby revoke & disavow all other Wills heretofore
by me made either in word or writings: And testify & confirm
= in this & no other to be my last will & Testament —
In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand & seal this
17th day July in the year of our Lord 1782

Iron brooch, pot hooks & Tongs & my own saddle & best
Dungtrough, two Chairs & my body clothes, Likewise
my pocket Bible. — Likewise I give & bequeath to
my beloved wife Jennet Wyllie the sord mare, saddle
& bridle, the cow that carries the milk & a four year old
Heifer with a white face, two Sheep, Book & furniture, &
spinning wheel, Likewise she is to have the charge & benefit
of the aforesaid articles during life or widowhood —
Likewise I bequeath to my daughter Jane Wyllie bed &
furniture Likewise the Dun mare saddle & bridle, two
Cows, two Sheep & some other furniture belonging to the
house such as her mother thinks proper, Likewise my
beloved wife is to have the charge & benefit of the afo-
-said articles bequeathed to my son James Wyllie until
he comes of age or during her widowhood & Likewise
she is to have a living during life if not other by Mann-
-er Likewise I constitute make & order my Executors Joseph
Reed & Jennet Wyllie & his my last will & testament & I do
utterly, absolutely, revoke & annul — & every other former testa-
ment, legacy & bequest, & give by me in any wise before now
made & bequeathed In testifying & confirming this &c

thirty pounds good & lawful money with two
year old & one year old horses Then I give & bequeath
to my well beloved daughter Elizabeth one Round Mare
& saddle & bridle her bed & furniture with all her
cloathing & the same year old horse Then I give
